

## CHILD SUPPORT EVADER RENEE HEBERT

Attorney General Greg Abbott needs your help to find Child Support Evader Renee Hebert. Hebert, who was named a



Child Support Evader in December 2004, owes \$12,134 for a son and daughter from Galveston.

In 1983, when Hebert and her husband divorced,

she was ordered to pay \$50 a month for the care of her two children. In November 2001, a Galveston County judge increased Hebert's monthly child support payment to \$250, based on her earnings at that time. An arrest warrant was issued when Hebert, who received legal notice, did not attend the court hearing to modify her child support obligation. She has not

made a payment in over four years. Due to missed payments and interest that accrues on unpaid child support, Hebert owes more than \$13,000.

Law enforcement and investigators from the Attorney General's Office have searched the state for Hebert. Contact the Attorney General's Office at 1-866-EVADERS (382-3377) to report information that may lead to the arrest of Renee Hebert.

Child Support Evaders are being singled out because they have the ability to take responsibility for their children, but refuse to do so. Incarceration is the only option for parents who flagrantly ignore a court's order to pay child support. ## **POINTS TO REMEMBER**



CRITERIA: For a parent to be named as a Most Wanted Child Support Evader:

- Court-ordered delinquent support must be in excess of \$5,000
- Arrest warrant must have been issued for non-support
- Location of non-custodial parent is unknown
- Parent has not made any payments in the last six months
- Non-custodial parent must not be involved in bankruptcy proceedings
- Non-custodial parent must not be receiving welfare benefits

In order to make child support information public, the custodial parent must sign a confidentiality waiver.
