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Initial Compliance Review Process

The Initial Compliance Review (ICR) is the first step in the compliance monitoring process. The ICR is an automated review of program-specific data indicators used to evaluate LEA compliance with federal program requirements. All LEAs that receive federal funds through a program administered by the TEA Division of NCLB Program Coordination undergo an annual ICR. If an LEA does not meet one or more of the ICR indicator standards, the ICR results are combined with the LEA's results in the PBMAS and a stage of intervention is determined for the LEA.

NOTE: For an LEA that misses only one indicator and has no performance issues based on results from PBMAS, the LEA will become part of a pool of LEAs from which a compliance validation sample will be selected.

About this Manual

This manual is designed as a guidance tool to assist in the process used to calculate the ICR indicators for NCLB. For each compliance item, the following are described.

Compliance Item

Describes the compliance item that is being evaluated.

Eligible Cohort

Describes the eligibility criteria for the compliance item.

Data Source
