State housing agency to make available housing assistance to flood victims

Department board gives Section 8 priority to disaster areas, speeds assistance to low income households in disaster-stricken regions

(AUSTIN) — Moving to help victims of flooding across the state, the Governing Board of the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) today approved an emergency measure authorizing a preference for disaster assistance to low income households displaced by natural disasters.

As a result of today's action, TDHCA will be able to provide rent payment assistance to qualifying residents through the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program to households impacted by disasters. The emergency rule change institutes a preference for disaster recovery efforts, allowing TDHCA to immediately begin issuing vouchers to residents in cities or counties in which the Department operates the program. The Department administers the Section 8 Program in 46 cities or counties where there is no local housing program operator.

"The emergency rule change greatly speeds up our ability to respond to this disaster," said Michael Gerber, TDHCA Executive Director. "In working closely with the Governor's Office Division of Emergency Management and with local housing officials, we are well aware of the devastation that this flooding has caused the state. Our board's action today enables us to assist our fellow Texans in need."

The Section 8 Program provides low income individuals and families help with paying their rent, providing financial assistance for safe, decent housing that might otherwise be beyond their reach. Qualified households select the best available housing through direct negotiations with landlords, and TDHCA pays approved rent amounts directly to property owners.
