## State housing agency, regional nonprofit helping area low income tenants secure decent housing

(AUSTIN) — Realizing that helping low income rural Texans secure decent affordable rental housing is the first step to setting them on the path toward self-sufficiency, the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) has announced a major funding award to a regional nonprofit organization serving a five-county area to help eligible individuals obtain housing while working toward financial and personal independence.

TDHCA awarded \$110,232 in rental assistance funds to Affordable Caring Housing, Inc., a nonprofit housing organization serving Anderson, Gregg, Henderson, Navarro, and Walker counties. The nonprofit, headquartered in College Station, will use the award to help an estimated 26 low-income households with their monthly rent payments.

"Finding a decent, affordable place to call home can be an enormous challenge for rural Texans," said TDHCA Executive Director Michael Gerber. "Incomes tend to be lower in rural communities, and residents typically have fewer rental housing choices. These funds will not only make an immediate impact on the lives of these tenants, they have the potential to create the long-term benefits of self-reliance."

Affordable Caring Housing will use the award to help subsidize rents and make security and utility deposits for eligible low income households, ensuring they can find decent, affordable rental housing. The assistance is available for up to 24 months. In return, tenants must participate in a self-sufficiency program with the goal of achieving eventual financial independence.

This award was made through TDHCA's HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, which is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. HOME funds are designed to assist households at or below 80 percent of the area median family income.
