# About the Office of the Secretary of State Elections Division



# National Voter Registration Act of 1993

#### Goals:

- Enhance voting opportunities for American citizens.
- Increase the number of eligible citizens who register to vote.
- Protect the integrity of the electoral process by ensuring that accurate and current voter rolls are maintained.

## Implementing NVRA Goals

- Expand the number of locations and opportunities where eligible citizens register to vote.
- Update voter registration maintenance procedures; identify and remove the names of voters no longer eligible.
- Provide fail-safe voting procedures to ensure that voters can vote.

## NVRA History in Texas

- National Voter Registration Act passed in Congress in 1993.
- Texas ahead of the curve—mail-in registrations, 30 day deadlines, motor voters. Driver's license holders accounted for 87% of eligible voters.
- 1994 Elections Division created Task Force and Administrative Rules for Texas.
- 1995 TVRS database created—now called TEAM.

## NVRA History in Texas

- Biggest change for incorporating NVRA was implementing agency-based registration.
- Public assistance agencies and agencies that provide services for the disabled were selected "to ensure that the poor and persons with disabilities, who do not have drivers licenses, will not be excluded."

## Texas NVRA Voter Registration Agencies

Sec. 20.001. DESIGNATION OF VOTER REGISTRATION AGENCIES

- (a) The following state agencies are designated as voter registration agencies:
- (1) Health and Human Services Commission;
- (2) Department of Aging and Disability Services;
- (3) Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services;
- (4) Department of State Health Services; and
- (5) any other agency or program as determined by the secretary of state that primarily provides:
  - (A) public assistance; or
  - (B) services to persons with disabilities.

## Additional Agencies

- (b) The Department of Public Safety is designated as a voter registration agency.
- (c) Each public library, including any branch or other service outlet, is designated as a voter registration agency. In this chapter, "public library" means a library that:
- (1) is regularly open for business for more than 30 hours a week;
- (2) is operated by a single public agency or board;
- (3) is open without charge to all persons under identical conditions; and
- (4) receives its financial support wholly or partly from public funds.
- (d) Each marriage license office of the county clerk is designated as a voter registration agency.
- (e) The secretary of state shall designate other agencies or offices as voter registration agencies as necessary for compliance with federal law.

## Voter Registration Agency Duties

- Designate an Agency Coordinator
- Offer each person who applies for agency services the opportunity to register to vote.
- Provide same degree of assistance, including bilingual assistance, to help the person complete the VR form as you would helping the person complete the agency forms

## Prohibited Acts Under NVRA

- An employee of a voter registration agency may not:
  - (1) seek to influence an applicant's political party preference;
  - (2) display any political party preference or allegiance; or
  - (3) make any statement or take any action the purpose or effect of which is to:
    - (A) discourage the applicant from registering to vote; or
    - (B) lead the applicant to believe that a decision of whether to register has any bearing on the availability of services or benefits

## Who is Eligible to Register to Vote?

- At least 18 years of age on election day
- United States Citizen
- Not a convicted felon (unless a person's sentence is completed, including any probation or parole)
- Not declared mentally incapacitated by a court of law
- Be a resident of the county where the application for registration is made.

## Determining Eligibility

- (a) An employee of a voter registration agency may not make a determination about a person's eligibility for registration other than a determination of whether the person is of voting age or is a United States citizen.
- (b) A person's age or citizenship may be determined by the employee only if the age or citizenship can be readily determined from information filed with the agency by the person for purposes other than voter registration.
- (c) A person shall be offered voter registration assistance as provided by this chapter even if the person's age or citizenship cannot be determined.

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
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Qualifications



## Applicants May Decline to Register

- (a) If the applicant does not wish to complete a voter registration application form, the agency employee shall request that the applicant complete and sign an official declination of registration form unless the employee determines that the applicant has previously completed and signed the form.
- (b) If the applicant refuses to sign the declination form, the agency employee shall enter on the form a notation of that fact.
- (c) The agency shall preserve each declination for at least 22 months after the date of signing. The declination may be retained in the applicant's file at the agency or in a separate declination file.
- (d) A declination is confidential and may be used only for voter registration purposes.
- (e) The secretary of state shall prescribe the procedures necessary to eliminate the filing of multiple declinations by an applicant.

## Official Declination of Registration Form

The officially prescribed form for a declination of a voter registration must include:

- spaces for the person's signature and printed name and the date of signing;
- the following question, followed by appropriate boxes preceding "YES" and "NO": "If you are not registered to vote where you live now, would you like to apply to register to vote here today?".
- If the agency provides public assistance, the statement: "Applying to register or declining to register to vote will not affect the amount of assistance that you will be provided by this agency."; and
- the statement: "IF YOU HAVE NOT CHECKED EITHER BOX, YOU WILL BE CONSIDERED TO HAVE DECIDED NOT TO REGISTER TO VOTE AT THIS TIME.";

## Official Declination of Registration Form

- The statement: "If you would like help filling out the voter registration application form, we will help you. The decision whether to seek or accept help is yours. You may fill out the application form in private.";
- The statement: "If you believe that someone has interfered with your right to register or to decline to register to vote or with your right to privacy in deciding whether to register or in applying to register to vote, you may file a complaint with the Elections Division of the Office of the Secretary of State, P.O. Box 12060, Austin, Texas 78711.";
- A statement that if the applicant declines to register to vote, that fact will remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes;
- a statement that if the applicant does register to vote, information regarding the agency or office to which the application is submitted will remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes; and
- a space for indicating that the applicant refused to sign the declination or kept the application to personally submit it to the voter registrar.

# Agency Review and Delivery of Applications

- Forms must be delivered to Voter Registrar not later than 5 days after being signed
- Business Reply Label –SOS pays the postage

## Services Rendered by Mail or Phone

- (b) An agency shall deliver to an applicant by mail a voter registration application form if:
  - (1) the agency automatically notifies an applicant to renew or recertify a service by mailing a form to the applicant; or
  - (2) the applicant requests services by telephone and the agency provides services in that manner.
- (c) An application form delivered by mail must be accompanied by a notice informing the applicant that the application may be submitted in person or by mail to the voter registrar of the county in which the applicant resides or in person to a volunteer deputy registrar for delivery to the voter registrar of the county in which the applicant resides.
- (d) The agency may maintain a written record indicating that a registration application was delivered to an applicant.
- (e) The agency is not required to deliver a declination of registration form under this section.

### Residence

- a. A voter's residence is his or her domicile, per Section 1.015 of the Code.
- b. Statutory residence (in the context of voter registration and candidacy) is domicile, and all the common-law elements evidencing domicile apply.
- c. An individual does not lose his or her residence by temporarily leaving his or her home

## Residence (cont'd)

- d. An individual does not acquire residence by staying in a place temporarily, if he or she lacks the intention of making that temporary dwelling place home.
- e. An inmate in a penal institution or an involuntary inmate in a hospital or eleemosynary institution does not acquire residence at the place where the institution is located, given the lack of intention presumed from the involuntary nature of the commitment.

## Important 2009-2010 Election Dates

- November 3, 2009 Constitutional Amendment Election
  - last day to register to vote is October 5, 2009
- March 2, 2010 Primary Election
  - last day to register to vote is February 1, 2010
- April 13, 2010 Primary Runoff Election
  - last day to register to vote is March 15, 2010
- May 8, 2010 Uniform Election
  - last day to register to vote is April 8, 2010
- November 2, 2010 General Election
  - last day to register to vote is October 4, 2010
