INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION OF THE PRIVATE BUSINESS LETTER OF AUTHORITY

Please include with your completed application form the following items:

- 1. Fee(s) submitted by mail, must also have a <u>PSB-50</u> (Application & Fee Submission) form attached. **Note: Fees submitted to the Board are not refundable or transferable.**
- 2. PSB-11 (Application for Letter Authority) form.
- 3. The statutory fee of \$400.00 registration fee + \$12.00 subscription fee= **\$412.00** in the form of a cashier's check or money order.
- 4. Application to qualify a manager on (<u>PSB-04A</u> Owner/Manager Application) form or <u>PSB-04B</u> if utilizing the online application process, along with the \$30.00 registration fee + subscription fee= \$33.00
- 5. Two (2) classifiable Board approved fingerprint cards along with the \$25.00 FBI classification fee
- 6. **Note:** If you are a Peace Officer, you are not required to submit fingerprints cards; however you must submit form <u>PSB-49</u> Peace Officer Fingerprint Waiver along with your application.
- 7. Certificate of Liability Insurance (no binders) on <u>PSB-05</u> form signed by an insurance agency licensed in Texas.
- 8. Uniform picture(s) showing the uniform(s), badge, identification nameplate and shoulder patch conforming to the requirements of Title 10, Chapter 1702 Occupations Code, as amended. Photographs must be legible and clear.

Note: Upon receipt of the above, the Texas Department of Public Safety Private Security Bureau will begin processing your application. Understand that there are additional requirements **AND** prohibitions that are involved in the Letter of Authority process.


- Manager must qualify by passing the manager qualification examination administered by the Board (140 questions – multiple choice – true/false).
- A Private Business Letter of Authority is not authorized or licensed to offer or provide services as an Investigations Company, Guard Company, Alarm Systems Company, Courier Company, Locksmith Company, Electronic Access Control Device Company, and/or Guard Dog Company required to be licensed under the provisions of Title 10, Chapter 1702 Occupations Code, as amended, on a contractual basis to any person, third party or entity.
- A Private Business Letter of Authority must apply for, and obtain a security officer commission from the Private Security Board for each individual employed to carry a firearm before that individual may carry a firearm.
- A Private Business Letter of Authority must provide to the Board a color photograph(s) of the uniform(s) they intend to use showing the uniform's badge, identification nameplate and if used, a shoulder patch containing the name of the private business as it appears for a Private Business Letter of Authority.

PRIVATE SECURITY BUREAU GUARD COMPANY & LETTER OF AUTHORITY FLOWCHART

1. Are you contracting to provide guard services to others?



- **3.** If employing non-commissioned guards, do the guards meet ALL of the conditions described in §1702.323(d), *i.e*, do they, *in the course of their employment*,
 - (a) come into contact with the public; AND
 - (b) wear a uniform *or* badge commonly associated with security or law enforcement, *or* a patch with wording that is likely to create the impression that they are security officers; *AND*
 - (c) perform the duties of a security guard, private watchman, guard, or street patrol service to:
 - (1) prevent entry, larceny, vandalism, abuse, fire, or trespass on private property;
 - (2) prevent, observe, or detect unauthorized activity on private property;
 - (3) control, regulate, or direct the movement of the public, whether by vehicle or otherwise, only to the extent and for the time directly and specifically required to ensure the protection of property;
 - (4) protect an individual from bodily harm including through the use of a personal protection officer; or
 - (5) perform a function similar to a function described above.



Guard Company License required*

No license required (Security Dept. of Private Business exemption) but must comply with records requirements of §1702.323(c)

* No license is required for political subdivisions to employ non-commissioned officers
