# **Health Care-related Opportunities**

## RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE

There is a Ronald McDonald House in almost every major city! When a child is very ill, he or she can be placed in a hospital for a long period of time. Families must then travel long distances to the hospital, and they can run into problems staying at expensive hotels night after night. The Ronald McDonald House provides a low-cost, comfortable, family-oriented atmosphere for families to stay during the child's treatment. #### **HOSPITALS**

Most hospitals (larger and small) have volunteer programs you could join that help patients in and out of the hospital. These volunteers programs can allow you to check out certain medical careers and gain wonderful work experience. Contact local hospitals to learn more about the opportunities in your area.

#### SENIOR CITIZENS CENTERS

Just like hospitals, many senior citizen centers offer volunteer programs where you could provide friendship and a helping hand to senior citizens in your community. If you would like working with older adults, make a call a senior citizen center in your neighborhood. They will be happy to talk to about any volunteer opportunities they have available!

## **Special Olympics**

As described on their web site, "Special Olympics is an international program of year-round sports training and athletic competition for children and adults with mental retardation." Special Olympics volunteers can get involved at the state/provincial, national or international level, or offer their services locally at a Special Olympics Program in their community. #### **Habitat for Humanities**

Habitat for Humanities builds and gives the houses to unfortunate people in many communities worldwide! There are MANY ways to get involved! ## **Animal Shelters**

## **Red Cross**

The American Red Cross helps people in emergencies — whether it's hurricane or flood relief or providing blood for just one patient. The Junior Red Cross provides young people with meaningful opportunities for education, training, and volunteer/community service so that they remain a part of the Red Cross family throughout their lives. ## **Environmental Organizations**

If you are passionate about the environment, think about volunteering for organizations like the Sierra Club or the Earth Day Network. You can lend a hand in many ways: writing letters or making phone calls to support environmental protection, by helping lobby on conservation issues, by leading hikes and other activities, or by lending a hand at the Chapter Office.

## **Homeless Shelters and Food Banks**

Most cities are home to at least one homeless shelter that helps those people less fortunate with meals, beds and additional services. Most shelters welcome volunteers and have a range of programs through which you can get involved. You might be asked to: help prepare or distribute meals; work behind the scenes in the business office; help organize a food drive to stock the pantry, etc.; collect clothes for residents of the shelter; or deliver a "brown bag" lunch directly to the homeless.

#### **Meals on Wheels**

Meals on Wheels is always looking for helpful youth! Volunteers are needed to help prepare and package dinners to be delivered, organize schedules, make phone calls, load delivery vehicles, and deliver meals.
