Adult Protective Services (APS) Reform

# Accomplishments

HHSC made 252 recommendations to reform the APS Program.

- 89 (35%) recommendations have been completed.
- 138 (55%) recommendations are scheduled for completion by September 2005.
- 13 (5%) recommendations are planned but not started.

All recommendations are scheduled to be completed by January 2006.

## Risk Assessment

#### HHSC and APS developed prototype

- 1<sup>st</sup> pre-test completed June 2004
- 2<sup>nd</sup> pre-test completed February 2005

## Pilot will begin in El Paso in May 2005

• Pilot will involve an automated version of the risk assessment model on mobile tablet computers.

Contract with University of Texas for external review

Full rollout expected summer 2005

# Staffing

## Implemented new regional structure 1/01/2005:

- Transitioned from 5 districts to 9 regions.
- Supervisor and caseworker positions added in each region.
- Subject matter experts added in each region:
  - Exploitation and Investigations;
  - Risk and Self-neglect;
  - Community Initiatives, and
  - Resource and External Relations.

## Technology

### Implement Mobile Technology

- DFPS issued an RFP for Tablet PCs December 2004.
  - Instant access to case information for workers in the field
  - Increased worker efficiency
- Tablet PCs will be piloted in El Paso May 2005.
- Statewide deployment by August 2005.

### Improve Current Automation Systems

- Improve worker access to accurate case information in IMPACT.
- Modify IMPACT to support mobile technology.

# Investigations and Service Delivery

## Developed and implemented new requirements:

- Conducting a thorough investigation
- Supervisor checkpoints that must occur in each case
- Early notification to law enforcement if a caseworker suspects criminal activity

## **Training**

- Revised and extended curriculum
- Implemented competency based model
- Extended training
- Enhanced modules on mental health and financial exploitation
- Guided field experience
- Hired 10 training staff in regions to facilitate access
