## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to consideration of mitigating factors in determining 3 appropriate disciplinary action to be taken against a public school 4 student.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
 SECTION 1. Section 37.001(a), Education Code, is amended to
 read as follows:

(a) The board of trustees of an independent school district 8 shall, with the advice of its district-level committee established 9 under Subchapter F, Chapter 11, adopt a student code of conduct for 10 The student code of conduct must be posted and 11 the district. 12 prominently displayed at each school campus or made available for review at the office of the campus principal. In addition to 13 14 establishing standards for student conduct, the student code of 15 conduct must:

(1) specify the circumstances, in accordance with this
subchapter, under which a student may be removed from a classroom,
campus, or disciplinary alternative education program;

19 (2) specify conditions that authorize or require a
 20 principal or other appropriate administrator to transfer a student
 21 to a disciplinary alternative education program;

(3) outline conditions under which a student may be suspended as provided by Section 37.005 or expelled as provided by Section 37.007;

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H.B. No. 171 specify that [whether] consideration will be [is] 1 (4) 2 given, as a factor in a decision regarding [to order] suspension, removal to a disciplinary alternative education program, 3 or 4 expulsion, to: 5 (A) self-defense; 6 (B) intent or lack of intent at the time the 7 student engaged in the conduct; 8 (C) a student's disciplinary history; or 9 (D) a disability that substantially impairs the student's capacity to appreciate the wrongfulness of the student's 10 conduct; 11 (5) provide guidelines for setting the length of a 12 term of: 13 a removal under Section 37.006; and 14 (A) 15 (B) an expulsion under Section 37.007; (6) address the notification of a student's parent or 16 guardian of a violation of the student code of conduct committed by 17 the student that results in suspension, removal to a disciplinary 18 alternative education program, or expulsion; 19 (7) prohibit bullying, harassment, and making hit 20 21 lists and ensure that district employees enforce those prohibitions; and 22 provide, as appropriate for students at each grade 23 (8) 24 level, methods, including options, for: 25 (A) managing students in the classroom and on school grounds; 26 disciplining students; and 27 (B)

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(C) preventing and intervening in student
 discipline problems, including bullying, harassment, and making
 hit lists.

4 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010 5 school year.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
