## **CHAPTER 754**

H.B. No. 2096

An Act relating to authorization of the State Preservation Board to provide for the offering of Sesquicentennial Commemorative products in the Capitol.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. Chapter 476, Acts of the 68th Legislature, Regular Session, 1983 (Article 6145-14, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended by adding Section 11A to read as follows:

Sec. 11A. SESQUICENTENNIAL COMMEMORATIVE PRODUCTS. (a) The State Preservation Board may select one vendor to sell sesquicentennial commemorative products in the Capitol during 1986. The board shall determine the location in the Capitol where the vendor may operate, and the form and appearance of the booth or stand from which the products are sold.

(b) The board may charge the vendor a reasonable fee for the right to operate in the Capitol. The proceeds of the fee shall be handled in the same manner as donations of money under

Section 8 of this Act.

(c) Chapter 94, Human Resources Code, does not apply to a vending facility under this section.

SECTION 2. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted.
