

**CHAPTER 476**

**H.B. No. 2428**

An Act relating to the Comal County Juvenile Board.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:*

**SECTION 1. COMPOSITION.** The Comal County Juvenile Board consists of the county judge and the judge of the 207th District Court.

**SECTION 2. POWERS.** The Comal County Juvenile Board has all the powers conferred on juvenile boards created under Article 5139, Revised Statutes, or by other general law.

**SECTION 3. COMPENSATION.** As compensation for the additional duties imposed on them, the members of the Comal County Juvenile Board may receive an annual salary in an amount set by the commissioners court, payable in equal monthly installments out of the general fund or any other available fund of the county. The compensation authorized by this section is in addition to all other compensation authorized by law for a judge.

**SECTION 4. APPLICATION.** This Act prevails over Chapter 163, Acts of the 57th Legislature, Regular Session, 1961 (Article 5139II, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), to the extent of any conflict.

**SECTION 5. EMERGENCY.** The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted.
