

CHAPTER 73

H.B. No. 1031

AN ACT

relating to expenses of the court reporter for the 112th Judicial District.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:*

SECTION 1. Sections 52.057(a) and (b), Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) Notwithstanding Section 52.055, the expenses of the official court reporters for the 31st, 46th, 104th, *112th*, and 155th judicial districts shall be reimbursed as prescribed by this section.

(b) The official court *reporters* [~~reporter~~] for the 31st *and 112th judicial districts are* [~~Judicial District is~~] entitled to receive travel expense allowances in the same amounts as a state employee. The *allowances* [~~allowance~~] shall be paid as prescribed by Sections 52.055(c) and (e).

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 1993.

SECTION 3. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended.

Passed by the House on March 24, 1993, by a non-record vote; passed by the Senate on April 21, 1993: Yeas 30, Nays 0.
