H.B. No. 974

AN ACT

relating to the County Court at Law of Kerr County.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. Sections 25.1352(b) and (d), Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

- (b) In addition to the jurisdiction provided by Section 25.0003 and other law, a county court at law in Kerr County has:
 - (1) concurrent jurisdiction with the district court in proceedings under the [Titles 1, 2, and 4,] Family Code; and
 - (2) concurrent with the county court, the jurisdiction of a probate court in proceedings under Chapter 462, Health and Safety Code, and Subtitle C, Title 7, Health and Safety Code.
- (d) A [The terms of a] county court at law has a term of court that begins January 1 and ends December 31 of each year [are the same as those of the county court].

SECTION 2. Sections 25.1352(a), (c), (f), (g), (i), (j), and (k), Government Code, are repealed.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 1993.

SECTION 4. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended.
