## CHAPTER 140

## S.B. No. 376

## AN ACT

relating to use of osteopathic hospitals by health maintenance and preferred provider organization

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 21, Insurance Code, is amended by adding Artic 21.53B to read as follows:

Art. 21.53B. USE OF OSTEOPATHIC HOSPITAL BY HEALTH MAINTENANC AND PREFERRED PROVIDER ORGANIZATIONS. (a) A health maintenance or preferred provider organization that contracts with a hospital to provide services to covere individuals may not refuse to contract with a particular hospital solely because that hospital is an osteopathic hospital.

(b) A health maintenance or preferred provider organization that provides benefits for inpatient or outpatient services provided by allopathic hospitals shall seek to provide benefit for similar services provided by an osteopathic hospital if there is an osteopathic hospit within the service area of the health maintenance or preferred provider organization the will provide those services at substantially similar cost.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 1993, and applies only to a contract mac or renewed on or after January 1, 1994. A contract made or renewed before January 1, 199 is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that la is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house house house and this rule is hereby suspended.
