## **CHAPTER 828**

## H.B. No. 2595

## AN ACT

relating to the abolition of the office of inspector of hides and animals in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. Section 146.052(a), Agriculture Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) This subchapter applies only in the following counties: Andrews, Baylor, Blanco, Briscoe, Castro, Coleman, Concho, Crane, Dawson, Duval, Ector, Edwards, [Fisher,] Gaines, Glasscock, Hardin, Haskell, Jefferson, Jim Wells, [Jones, Kent,] Kerr, Kimble, [King,] LaSalle, Lee, Liberty, McCulloch, McMullen, Martin, Menard, Mitchell, [Nolan,] Ochiltree, Presidio, Real, Roberts, Runnels, San Jacinto, San Saba, Sherman, [Stonewall,] Sutton, [Taylor, Travis,] Walker, Waller, [Webb,] Wood, and Yoakum.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect January 1, 1991.

SECTION 3. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended.
