

CHAPTER 334

S.B. No. 1478

AN ACT

relating to abolishing a transit authority.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:*

SECTION 1. Subsection (k), Section 5, Chapter 141, Acts of the 63rd Legislature, Regular Session, 1973 (Article 1118x, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended to read as follows:

(k) If the continued existence of an authority is not confirmed by election within three years after the effective date of the ordinance creating the authority, the authority ceases to exist on the expiration of the three years. *In addition, the governing body of a*

*principal city that has created an authority that has not been confirmed by election may, with the consent of the board of the authority, abolish the authority at any time before confirmation or expiration of the authority under this section.*

SECTION 2. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted.

Passed the Senate on May 19, 1987, by the following vote: Yeas 30, Nays 0. Passed the House on May 29, 1987, by the following vote: Yeas 147, Nays 0, one present not voting.
