S.B. No. 162

AN ACT

relating to the compensation and office of the county attorney of Milam County.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 45, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 45.266 to read as follows:

- Sec. 45.266. MILAM COUNTY. (a) For representing the state before the district court in Milam County, the county attorney of Milam County is entitled to be compensated by the state in the same manner and amount as provided by general law for district attorneys. The commissioners court of Milam County may also compensate the county attorney in an amount it considers advisable.
- (b) The county attorney of Milam County is entitled to receive from the state an amount for the payment of staff salaries and office expenses equal to the amount provided in the General Appropriations Act to be paid for those purposes to a district attorney who serves a single county.
- (c) If the county attorney of Milam County receives compensation or expenses from the state under this Act, Milam County is not entitled to receive funds under Subchapter C, Chapter 41, Government Code.
 - SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 1987.
- SECTION 3. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended.
