

CHAPTER 310

S.B. No. 236

AN ACT

relating to the supplemental compensation of the district judges in Lubbock County.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. (a) Effective September 1, 1987, the Commissioners Court of Lubbock County may pay each district judge an annual salary set by the commissioners court at not less than \$4,000 for service on the juvenile board. This subsection expires January 1, 1988.

(b) Effective January 1, 1988, the Commissioners Court of Lubbock County may pay each district judge an annual salary set by the commissioners court at not less than \$6,500 for service on the juvenile board.

(c) The compensation authorized by this section is payable in equal monthly installments out of the general fund of the county or any other available county fund and is in addition to all other compensation provided or allowed by law for a district judge.

SECTION 2. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended.

Passed the Senate on April 15, 1987, by the following vote: Yeas 31, Nays 0; and that the Senate concurred in House amendment on June 1, 1987, by a viva-voce vote.

Passed the House, with amendment, on May 29, 1987, by a non-record vote.

Approved June 11, 1987.

Effective Aug. 31, 1987, 90 days after date of adjournment.
