## **CHAPTER 38**

S.B. No. 308

AN ACT

relating to the right of a property owner to inspect records and data used in making an ad valorem tax appraisal of his property.

SECTION 1. Section 25.195, Tax Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 25.195. INSPECTION BY PROPERTY OWNER. After the chief appraiser has submitted the appraisal records to the appraisal review board as provided by Section 25.22(a) of this code, a property owner or his designated agent may inspect the appraisal records relating to property of the property owner, together with supporting data [as defined in Section 25.01(c) of this code] and schedules used in making appraisals for the appraisal records[7] relating to that property [of the property owner].

SECTION 2. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted.

Passed the Senate on February 26, 1987, by the following vote: Yeas 30, Nays 0. Passed the House on April 15, 1987, by the following vote: Yeas 136, Nays 0, one present not voting.
