

CHAPTER 156

S.B. No. 333

AN ACT

relating to the establishment of certain foreign trade zones.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. The City of Lubbock, organized and incorporated under the laws of the State of Texas, or another corporation organized under the laws of the State of Texas and designated by the City of Lubbock, is authorized to apply for and accept a grant to establish, operate, and maintain a foreign trade zone adjacent to the U.S. Customs Port of Entry at Lubbock, and other subzones, subject to the requirements of federal law and the regulations of the Foreign Trade Zones Board.

SECTION 2. The City of Midland, organized and incorporated under the laws of the State of Texas, or another corporation organized under the laws of the State of Texas and designated by the City of Midland is authorized to apply for and accept a grant to establish, operate, and maintain a foreign trade zone adjacent to the Midland Regional Airport, and other subzones, subject to the requirements of federal law and the regulations of the Foreign Trade Zones Board.

SECTION 3. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the

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constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted.

Passed the Senate on March 26, 1987, by the following vote: Yeas 30, Nays 0; and that the Senate concurred in House amendment on May 12, 1987, by a viva-voce vote.

Passed the House, with amendment, on May 8, 1987, by a non-record vote.

Approved May 25, 1987.

Effective Aug. 31, 1987, 90 days after date of adjournment.
