



## **Directions**

From the intersection of RR 620 and FM 2222, travel south 4.9 miles. Turn right onto Mansfield Dam Road, just south of Mansfield Dam. The park entrance is on your left.

# **Description**

As the name suggests, Mansfield Dam Park is located adjacent to Mansfield Dam on the main body of Lake Travis and serves as one of the primary access points for boaters. Other popular attractions include picnicking, swimming, sunbathing, scuba diving and camping.

Mansfield Dam Park accommodates many user groups, including scuba divers, swimmers, boaters, picnickers and nature enthusiasts. The park provides dive stairs, a wheelchair-accessible ramp and a courtesy ADA dive lift to ease the trek from hillside to shoreline for the mobility impaired. Underwater amusement is enhanced with four underwater dive platforms at various lake levels. The park also features an underwater dive trail and compass course, which connects several dive attractions such as sunken boats, historic dam construction materials and geological points of interest.

## **Entrance Fees**

- Day use = \$8.00
- Pedestrian / Bicyclist = \$3.00
- Camping = \$20.00 per vehicle, per night (plus a \$10.00 reservation fee)
- Lone Star Pass = Free to persons 62 years of age or older and disabled veterans (> 60% disability)
- Annual Permits = \$75.00 per vehicle. Permit expires on the last day of the month, one year following purchase. Permit enables free day use.
- Trailer Parking = \$2.00 per trailer, per day
- Annual Trailer Parking Permit = \$30.00 per trailer (available to annual & duplicate annual permit holders)

## **Camping Information**

- There are six camping pods available with different group size limits.
- Restrooms with indoor/outdoor showers and payphone are located in the camping area.
- Ground fires are permitted, as seasonal conditions allow. However, the cutting or gathering of firewood, including kindling, is prohibited in all Travis County Parks. Firewood can be purchased from local businesses. Campers may obtain a free campfire permit when they enter the park with firewood.
- Dogs and other pets are permitted in the park, but must be kept on leashes unless in the water, and may not be left unattended at any time.
- Glass containers and fireworks are prohibited in all Travis County Parks.
- Quiet hours are between 10:00 PM and 7:00 AM.
   All radios and generators must be turned off during quiet hours.
