GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES

Performs complex engineering work in the statewide soil and water conservation and nonpoint source pollution abatement programs. Serves as staff engineer performing assignments and providing technical support in planning, design, management and implementation of programs and practices related to the agency responsibilities in soil and water conservation, nonpoint source pollution management and other areas. Participates in health and safety training.

EXAMPLES OF WORK PERFORMED

Coordinates planning, development, implementation of all agency managed water quality management plans.

Performs technical work necessary for the development and certification of all water quality management plans.

Oversees the collection of engineering data required for all water quality management plans development and certification.

Provides technical support and training to other staff as necessary.

Provides information and guidance to agriculture producers in conjunction with agency programs.

Performs field technical work necessary for performance of surveying, design, layout, checkout, and status reviews of all Water Quality Management Plans.

Performs other activities as assigned.

Experience in engineering work. Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with a degree in engineering or a related field.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

Should have some knowledge of federal and state environmental and conservation laws, programs and agencies. Good communication skills, both written and verbal, are required. Must have a working knowledge of computers and related software. Must be able to safely and legally operate a motor vehicle, ability to operate an ATV, safely lift (15-44 lbs.), and sustain moderate physical activity with full range of motion in office and outdoor environments.

REGISTRATION, CERTIFICATION, OR LICENSURE

A Texas Professional Engineer's license is required.
