The average taxable value of a residence homestead in <u>Lubbock County</u> last year was \$95,194. Based on last year's tax rate of \$0.306148 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed last year on the average home was \$291.43.

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in <u>Lubbock County</u> this year is \$100,370. If the governing body adopts the effective tax rate for this year of \$0.295126 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$296.22.

If the governing body adopts the proposed tax rate of \$0.326200 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$327.41.
