 A water quickly, take photos and return it to the water quickly. Weighing is optional.
 Keep the fish in water as much as possible prior to release. Remove hook with pliers or cut the line. Gently place the fish back into the water. Do not hang the fish on a stringer or gaff. If necessary, revive the fish by holding it upright in the water and moving it back and forth, forcing water through its gills

- hibited. No scent, either natural or artificial is allowed on flies. The use of scented material in a fly is prohibited.
- 2. The rod, reel, line, and leader equipment used must be designed for fly fishing.
- casting is that the weight of the line must carry the lure rather than the weight of the lure carrying the line.

Length Measurements

- 1. Place fish on its side with the jaw closed.
- 2. Squeeze the tail fin together or turn it in a way to obtain the maximum overall length.
- 3. Measure a straight line from the tip of the snout to the extreme tip of the tail fin.

Photographs (Catch and Release Records, State Records by Weight and Water Body Records)

- not be returned. Photos may be mailed with application form or sent by E-mail.
- The fins must be visible. Another must be of the angler with the fish.
- 3. Get close enough so that the image fills the frame. Make sure anal and dorsal fins are spread out and visible.

Verification of Fish Species (Catch and Release Records, State Records by Weight and Water Body Records)

- 1. Fish species identification is required for record applications.

Weight Record applications

- in grocery stores, post offices, feed mills, fertilizer plants, marinas and bait stores.
- scale, the applicant will have 30 days from the weighing date to have the weighing scales certified.
- 3. The fish must not contain anything or have anything attached which artificially increases weight.
- 4. One or more disinterested witnesses must observe the weighing.



INFORMATION AND RULES

1. The lure must be a recognized type of artificial fly. A fly may be dressed on a single or double hook or two single hooks in tandem. Treble hooks are prohibited. The use of any other type of lure or natural or preserved bait, either singularly or attached to the fly, is pro-

3. Casting and retrieving must be carried out in accordance with normal customs and generally accepted practices. The major criterion in



1. Photographs must be submitted with applications. Photos become the property of TPWD with publication and television rights and will

2. Clear, color, sideview photographs of the fish are required. Several photographs taken from different angles should be taken. One should show the fish lying on its side, the surface beneath the fish should be smooth and a ruler or marked tape placed beside the fish.

4. If the fish species is a shark, photos of the teeth as well as photos of the head and back taken from above must be submitted with the application along with sideview photographs. Whether a shark does or does not have a ridge between the dorsal fins should be clearly

2. Texas Parks and Wildlife Department fisheries biologists identify the fish species from the photos submitted with the application. 3. For weight records, if the TPWD fisheries biologist is unable to conclusively identify the species from the photographs, then the angler must provide the fish (whole and intact - except for tilapia and grass carp which must have intestines removed immediately after catch)

1. Fish (fresh and salt water) must be weighed on certifiable or legal for trade scales within 3 days of the date of catch. Scales are found

2. Certified scales are scales (either electronic or spring) that have been certified as accurate by the Texas Department of Agriculture, the International Game Fish Association, or an independent commercial scales calibration company. If fish are weighed on a non-certified

RULES FOR ALL AWARD CATEGORIES

2. An Angler Recognition Award Application Form (PWD BR T3200-349B) completed by the angler must be received by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department within 60 days of the date of catch. The 60-day limit will be waived for catches recognized as world records by the

3. The fish must be caught while obeying all laws or regulations governing the fish species and the waters in which it was caught.

4. Only one person may catch the fish (except for netting or gaffing the fish to bring it into the boat or onto shore).

6. Any deliberate falsification of any application will result in disgualification. All existing records will be removed and future applications from the

7. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department reserves the right to review, investigate, reject, disqualify, or accept any application submitted or any
