Under the provisions of Section 413.031 of the Texas Workers' Compensation Act, Title 5, Subtitle A of the Texas Labor Code, effective January 1, 2002 and Commission Rule 133.305 and 133.308 titled Medical Dispute Resolution by Independent Review Organizations, the Medical Review Division assigned an IRO to conduct a review of the disputed medical necessity issues between the requestor and the respondent.

The Medical Review Division has reviewed the IRO decision and determined that **the requestor prevailed** on the issues of medical necessity. Therefore, upon receipt of this Order and in accordance with §133.308(q)(9), the Commission hereby orders the respondent and non-prevailing party to **refund the requestor \$460.00** for the paid IRO fee. For the purposes of determining compliance with the order, the Commission will add 20 days to the date the order was deemed received as outlined on page one of this order.

In accordance with §413.031(e), it is a defense for the carrier if the carrier timely complies with the IRO decision.

Based on review of the disputed issues within the request, the Medical Review Division has determined that **medical necessity was the only issue** to be resolved. The office visits, therapeutic activities, physical medicine procedure, special supplies, spray & stretch, massage therapy, electrical stimulation and reports were found to be medically necessary. The respondent raised no other reasons for denying reimbursement for these office visits, therapeutic activities, physical medicine procedure, special supplies, spray & stretch, massage therapy, electrical stimulation and report charges.

This Finding and Decision is hereby issued this 13th day of June 2003.

The patient was initially diagnoses with cervicobrachial syndrome, sprain of shoulder and upper arm and myalgia and myosotis. The patient had an MRI 3/17/00 that showed midline disc protrusion at the C3-4 and C4-5 level and partial impingement syndrome with partial tear of the supraspinatus tendon portion of the rotator cuff. The patient underwent right shoulder surgery on 1/03/01 and cervical epidural steroid injections on 1/17/02 and 8/15/02, and was also treated with passive and active therapy. |
| <u>Requested Services</u> Therapeutic activities, office visits, physical medicine procedure, special supplies, spray & stretch, massage therapy, electrical stimulation, special report from 8/12/02 through 9/30/02. |
| Rationale/Basis for Decision The Carrier's determination that these services were not medically necessary for the treatment of this patient's condition is overturned. |
| Rationale/Basis for Decision The chiropractor reviewer noted that this case concerns 47 year-old female who sustained a work related injury to her right shoulder and neck on The chiropractor reviewer also noted that the diagnoses for this patient included midline disc protrusion at the C3-4 and C4-5 level and partial |

impingement syndrome with parital tear of the supraspinatus tendon portion of the rotator cuff. The ____ chiropractor reviewer further noted that the patient was treated with right shoulder surgery on 1/03/01,

cervical epidural steroid injections on 1/17/02 and 8/15/02 and was also treated with passive and active therapy. The ___ chiropractor reviewer explained that after a review of the medical records provided, the services from 8/12/02 through 9/30/02 were medically necessary. Therefore, the ___ chiropractor consultant concluded that the therapeutic activities, office visits, physical medicine procedure, special supplies, spray & stretch, massage therapy and electrical stimulation, special report from 8/12/02 through 9/30/02 were medically necessary to treat this patient's condition.
