Under the provisions of Section 413.031 of the Texas Workers' Compensation Act, Title 5, Subtitle A of the Texas Labor Code, effective June 17, 2001 and Commission Rule 133.305 titled <a href="Medical Dispute">Medical Dispute</a> <a href="Medical Dispute">Resolution - General</a> and 133.308 titled <a href="Medical Dispute Resolution by Independent Review Organizations">Medical Dispute Resolution by Independent Review Organizations</a>, the Medical Review Division (Division) assigned an IRO to conduct a review of the disputed medical necessity issues between the requestor and the respondent. The dispute was received on July 29, 2003.

The Medical Review Division has reviewed the IRO decision and determined that **the requestor prevailed** on the issues of medical necessity. Therefore, upon receipt of this Order and in accordance with § 133.308(r)(9), the Commission hereby Orders the respondent and non-prevailing party to **refund the requestor \$650.00** for the paid IRO fee. For the purposes of determining compliance with the Order, the Commission will add 20-days to the date the Order was deemed received as outlined on page one of this Order.

In accordance with §413.031(e), it is a defense for the carrier if the carrier timely complies with the IRO decision.

Based on review of the disputed issues within the request, the Medical Review Division has determined that **medical necessity was the only issue** to be resolved. The therapeutic exercises were found to be medically necessary. The respondent raised no other reasons for denying reimbursement of the therapeutic exercises.

This patient had a fracture of his left ankle on and later underwent an open reduction and internal fixation (ORIF). He attended physical therapy post operatively and then a work hardening program.

## Requested Service(s)

Therapeutic exercises from 07/29/02 through 09/11/02

### Decision

It is determined that the therapeutic exercises from 07/29/02 through 09/11/02 were medically necessary to treat this patient's condition.

# Rationale/Basis for Decision

This patient works in metal construction. After this type of surgical procedure, the ORIF of his left ankle, there would be significant residual stiffness and weakness that would affect his work. Physical therapeutics as well as a work hardening program would be most beneficial to restore full function to his lower extremity. Therefore, it is determined that the therapeutic exercises from 07/29/02 through 09/11/02 were medically necessary.
