PART IV: RESPONDENT'S POSITION SUMMARY

This is a medical fee dispute arising from an inpatient hospital surgical admission, dates of service 05-28-04 through 06-01-04. Requestor billed a total of \$60,802.09. The Requestor asserts it is entitled to reimbursement in the amount of \$45,601.57, which is 75% of the total charges. Requestor has not shown entitlement to this alternative, exceptional method of calculating reimbursement and has not otherwise properly calculated the audited charges.

PART V: MEDICAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION REVIEW SUMMARY, METHODOLOGY, AND/OR EXPLANATION

This dispute relates to inpatient services provided in hospital setting with reimbursement subject to the provisions of Rule 134.401 (Acute Care Inpatient Hospital Fee Guideline). The hospital has requested additional reimbursement according to the stop-loss method contained in that rule. Rule 134.401(c)(6) establishes that the stop-loss method is to be used for "unusually costly services." The explanation that follows this paragraph indicates that in order to determine if "unusually costly services" were provided, the admission must not only exceed \$40,000 in total audited charges, but also involve "unusually extensive services."

After reviewing the documentation provided by the provider, primary procedure of L5-S1 laminectomy, diskectomy and fusion, and the patient being discharged on the fourth postoperative day, walking independently, with no untoward medical problems, it does **not** appear that this particular admission involved "unusually extensive services." Accordingly, the stop-loss method does not apply and the reimbursement is to be based on the per diem plus carve-out methodology described in the same rule.

The total length of stay for this admission was four (4) days (consisting of 4 days for surgical). Accordingly, the standard per diem amount due for this admission is equal to \$4,472.00 (4 times \$1,118.00). In addition, the hospital is entitled to additional reimbursement for (implantables/MRIs/CAT Scans/pharmaceuticals) as follows:

An invoice from Zimmer US Inc in the amount of $1,894.00 \times 110\% = 2,083.40$ An invoice from Zimmer Spine in the amount of $3,265.00 \times 110\% = 3,591.50$ An invoice from Scient'X USA in the amount of $6,650.00 \times 110\% = 7,315.00$

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Based on the facts of this situation, the parties' positions and the application of the provisions of Rule 134.401(c), we find that the health care provider is entitled to an additional reimbursement amount for these services equal to \$16.50 (\$4,472.00 plus \$2,083.40, plus

PART VI: COMMISSION DECISION

The carrier has reimbursed the provider \$17,445.40.

3,591.50, plus 7,315.00 = 17,461.90 minus carrier payment of 17,445.40).

Based upon the review of the disputed healthcare services, the Medical Review Division has determined that the requestor is is entitled to additional reimbursement in the amount of <u>\$16.50</u>. The Division hereby **ORDERS** the insurance carrier to remit this amount plus all accrued interest due at the time of payment to the Requestor within 20 days of receipt of this Order.
