For DADS, funding in this strategy is for the construction and renovation of facilities at the state schools for persons with mental retardation. The vast majority of projects currently funded and underway are to bring existing facilities into compliance with the requirements in the Life Safety Code and/or other critical repairs and renovations, including fire sprinkler systems, fire alarm systems, emergency generators, fire/smoke walls, roofing, air conditioning, heating, electrical, plumbing, etc.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS IMPACTING STRATEGY:

The large number of buildings on state school campuses and the age of many of these buildings necessitates ongoing capital investments to ensure that the buildings are functional, safe, and in compliance with all pertinent standards. Compliance with such standards is mandatory to avoid the loss of federal funding for the state facilities. A comprehensive and standardized facility assessment was completed, validating current repair and rehabilitation needs. The database of current and projected needs developed through this assessment provided input into the amounts of Proposition 8 bond funds earmarked for state facilities over the next several years. Exceptional item #9 requests funding for repair and renovation of state facilities and state-owned bond homes. The request emphasizes Life Safety Code compliance in client residence and support buildings, as well as structural integrity and functionality improvements (e.g., roofs, air conditioning/heating systems, electrical/plumbing systems, etc.). This exceptional item requests the remaining balance of the voter-approved Proposition 8 bond package earmarked for MR facilities.
