Consider and take appropriate action on approving the setting of a Public Hearing on July 7, 2009 to receive comments regarding a request to authorize the filing of an instrument to vacate a 25' x 194.01' (0.11 acre) drainage easement as recorded in Volume 12390, Pages 558-559 of the Real Property Records of Travis County, Texas located across a portion of Lot 5, Block A of Paleface Ranch Subdivision, Section 2B as recorded in Book 95, Pages 86-91 of the Plat Records of Travis County, Texas – all being in Travis County, Precinct 3.

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

TNR has received a request from the property owner requesting to vacate a 0.11 acre drainage easement. The actual dimensions of the subject drainage easement to be vacated is 25' x 194.01' and is recorded at Volume 12390, Pages 558-559 of the Real Property Records of Travis County, Texas. The location of the subject easement is across a portion of Lot 5, Block A of Paleface Ranch Subdivision, Section 2B as recorded in Book 95, Pages 86-91 of the Plat Records of Travis County, Texas. The purpose of this request is so that the property owner can receive the proper permits to install a septic drain field, which currently would cross over the subject drainage easement.

Professional Engineer, W. H. (Bill) Balzen, has stated:

"The area where the OSSF disposal filed is located shows no signs of surface flow which would result in erosion, channeling, and loss of topsoil. Simply stated 'This is not a natural drainage area, or there is has not sufficient surface flow to cause erosion."

Mr. Balzen further states "Conclusion: There is no compelling reason why the drainage easement needs to be where shown."

Page 2 May 27, 2009

For the County to recommend the approval of vacating the subject drainage easement, staff has requested the dedication of a new drainage easement. The property owner has met this request and has submitted the new easement dedication. The new easement will be recorded simultaneously with the approved Vacation Order.

With the dedication of the new drainage easement, Travis County Engineer, Don Grigsby, has stated he has no objections to this vacation. TNR recommends the vacation of the 25' x 194.01' (0.11 acre) drainage easement as described in the attached Order of Vacation and as shown on the attached field notes and sketch.

Issues and Opportunities:

With the vacation of the existing drainage easement and the dedication of the new drainage easement, the property owner will be able to receive the proper permits to do improvements on the said lot, including the proposed septic drain field, without encroaching on the existing drainage easement. Travis County has relied on Mr. Balzen's professional opinion as a Professional Engineer in regards to this vacation.



Dear Mr. Scogins:

I am writing to request your assistance in vacating a drainage easement. I am building a home at 1516 Likeness Road in Spicewood. (Paleface Ranch Subdivision, Section 2B, Lot 5A) The lot has a rocky terrain but has suitable soil for a septic system drain field only in the area in which the drainage easement is located. Having owned the lot for almost fifteen years I have observed the water run off from the road in this area on many occasions. The road has a slight slope to the east and therefore almost all the water runs to the east side, well away from the plated drainage easement and proposed drain field. If the drainage easement were vacated or relocated to the area in which the vast majority of the run off actually flows it would more accurately designate the area that needs to be reserved for drainage and would allow adequate area for the septic system drain field. Another factor regarding the placement of the drainage easement is that it is likely that its location was initially determined well before the completion of the roadway. On the first plat of this area the location of the drainage easement was at the property line between lot four and lot five. When the plat was changed increasing the size of lot five I suspect the drainage easement was not reconsidered or relocated. It is also likely that an on-site observation of water run off was not done at this time as the drainage easement was established before the final plat was approved. Therefore, the current location of the drainage easement is not an area in which a substantial amount of water run off occurs.

I have been working with Bill Balzen, P.E., on the design and location of the proposed septic system. I have discussed this with Malinda Pate, Bart Carter and Erik Harris of the Lower Colorado River Authority. Mr. Carter noted that he could not approve the drain field location within a drainage easement and suggested that I contact an attorney for assistance in relocating it. I consulted with Robert Wilson and he suggested I contact your office for assistance in this matter. Enclosed you will find all required information for the requested vacation of the drainage easement.

- 1. REQUEST: THE 25 FT DRAINAGE EASMENT NOW CROSSING THE OSSF DISPOSAL FIELD BE EITHER VACATED AND RELOCATED, OR MODIFIED (TO ALLOW THE DISPOSAL FIELD BE INSTALLED AS DESIGNED).
- 2. RECENT HISTORY: REF: OSSF WAS DESIGNED AND APPROVED BY LCRA. INSTALLATION OF THE OSSF COMMENCED, BUT WAS HALTED UPON DISCOVERY OF THE DRAINAGE EASMENT (POOR QUALITY THE DRAWINGS USED IN THE DESIGN WERE NOT "READABLE". THE DRAINAGE EASMENT WAS ASSUMED TO BE A "CONSERVATION EASMENT" TO BE VACATED BY KEN THORENSON IAW LCRA REQUIREMENTS).
- 3. OLDER HISTORY: THE THORENSONS HAVE OWNED LOT 5 FOR APPROXIMATELY YEARS AND ARE INTIMATELY FAMILIAR WITH SURFACE "RUNOFF" OF RAINWATER. THERE HAS NOT BEEN A HISTORY OF SURFACE WATER RUNNING ACROSS THE AREA OF THE OSSF DISPOSAL FIELD.
- 4. ANCIENT HISTORY: THE AREA WHERE THE OSSF DISPOSAL FIELD IS LOCATED SHOWS NO SIGNS OF SURFACE FLOW WHICH WOULD RESULT IN ERROSION, CHANNELING AND LOSS OF TOPSOIL. SIMPLY STATED "THIS IS NOT A NATURAL DRAINAGE AREA, OR THERE IS HAS NOT SUFFICIENT SURFACE FLOW TO CAUSE EROSION".
- 5. GENERAL OBSERVATIONS: SURFACE WATER FLOWS FROM THE DOMINENT WATERSHED TOWARD THE PEDERNALES BRANCH OF LAKE TRAVIS TO THE EAST OF LIKENESS RD. LOCALIZED SURFACE FLOWS ARE TOWARD THE SMALL "CANYON" TO THE SOUTH WHICH FLOWS TO LAKE TRAVIS. DITCHES ON EITHER SIDE OF LIKENESS RD. AND AROUND THE CULDESAC CARRY THE BULK OF THIS WATER TO SOUTHEAST OF THE CULDESAC AND INTO LOT 4.
- 6. ANALYSIS OF RECENT TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY: A LOCALIZED TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY IN THE AREA OF CONCERN IS ATTACHED IN PLUS TWO "MARKED UP" OPTIONS. CONTOUR LINES ARE AT 1 FT. ELEVATIONS. THESE COUNTOURS INDICATE THERE IS NO "DEFINED" CHANNEL FOR SURFACE FLOWS EXCEPT AROUND THE CULDESAC AND ON TO LOT 4.
- 7.CONCLUSION: THERE IS NO COMPELLING REASON WHY THE DRAINAGE EASMENT NEEDS TO BE WHERE SHOWN.

- 8. THE OSSF DESIGN: SHOWS A LPD (LOW PRESSURE DOSE) DISPOSAL FIELD. THIS SYSTEM REQUIRES "DEEP" NATURAL TOPSOIL FOR TREATMENT OF THE SEPTIC TANK EFFLUENT. THE ONLY AREA ON LOT 5 THAT IS SUITABLE FOR THIS TYPE OF OSSF IS THE AREA SELECTED. THIS DESIGN ALSO PROVIDES FOR A BERM DIVERTING SURFACE WATER AROUND THE DISPOSAL FIELDS. OTHER OSSF TYPES ARE NOT RECOMMENDED BY THE DESIGNER FOR REASONS WHICH CAN BE ARGUED.
- 9. THE REQUEST FOR VACATION OF DRAINAGE EASMENT:
 - A. PREFERRED OPTION 1: VACATE THE EASMENT AS NOW EXISTS AND ESTABLISH A NEW DRAINAGE EASMENT TO THE WEST OF THE DRIVEWAY, WITH BERMS/DITCHES AS REQUIRED TO DIRECT SURFACE WATER FROM LIKENESS COVE TO THIS EASMENT. 





Requested Action

Approve an amended resolution supporting the TCHFC application to the TDHCA for NSP1 Funding.

Background

On April 14, 2009 the Travis County Commissioner's Court approved a resolution supporting the application of the TCHFC to TDHCA for NSP1 funding. A completed NSP1 application was submitted to TDHCA on April 27, 2009. The total requested amount was \$1,372,540 (\$847,540 direct allocation, \$525,000 "as-available" allocation) for financing mechanisms to stabilize neighborhoods facing high rates of foreclosures.

On June 23, 2009, TDHCA notified TCHFC staff that one administrative deficiency was noted on our application. The Travis County Resolution included in the application failed to acknowledge that the Texas NSP is a reimbursement program and failed to provide the name and title of the person with signatory authority to execute the contract.

The attached amended resolution has been reviewed by TDHCA staff and does meet these requirements. Only one change was made to the resolution, the inclusion of the following paragraph:

"Whereas, Travis County acknowledges that the Texas NSP is a reimbursement program and designates Samuel T. Biscoe, Travis County Housing Finance Corporation - Board President, with signatory authority to execute the Texas NSP contract."

Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of the amended resolution.

PROPOSED MOTION:

Consider and take appropriate action on:

- A. Blackstone Vineyard Preliminary Plan (159 Lots 210 acres 13005 Fitzhugh Rd.– Water service provided by the LCRA and wastewater service to be provided by on-site septic systems– City of Austin ETJ –mostly in Hays Co.)
- B. Approve the Phasing Agreement for Blackstone Vineyard Preliminary Plan

SUMMARY AND STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

This final plat subdivision consists of a total 150 lots for single-family residential and 9 lots for drainage/common area on 210 acres. Of those 210 acres, 6.52 acres are in Travis County with 4 common area lots, 1 drainage/common area lot and part of 5 residential lots. There are 1,603 total linear feet of new roads in Travis County within the proposed plan. No fiscal is required at this time.

The Phasing Agreement addresses the construction of a left turn lane into the subdivision from Fitzhugh Road once the developer final plats more than 50 lots.

This proposed plan encompasses three review jurisdictions, Travis County, Hays County, and the City of Austin.

As this final plat meets all Travis County standards and has been approved by the City of Austin Zoning and Platting Commission and the Hays County Commissioner's Court on June 17, 2009, TNR staff recommends approval of the plat.

ISSUES:

Staff has received several inquiries from area neighbors. Mr. Chad Swedberg was concerned with potential emergency access from the subdivision to Trail Driver Rd. However, the project was redesigned to change the emergency access to Fitzhugh Road and the ESD concurred with the plan. Linda and Rod Kleman expressed concerns about the location of the new septic fields in relation to their existing water well. Staff received other inquiries from neighbors regarding potential increase in traffic on Fitzhugh Rd. Other contacts were generic requests for information. No neighbors attended or spoke at the Zoning and Platting Commission or the Hays County Commissioner's Court meeting and the case was approved as a consent item by both bodies.




Location map Proposed plan Phasing Agreement






LOCATION MAP



Chad,

Thanks for bringing this community concern to my attention. Per our telephone call this afternoon, let me provide comments to all.

First, Hays County staff and our office have been fully engaged in the development process and working with Mr. Nemec, Travis County and City of Austin. Our environmental compliance specialist, Betty Lambright, and development coordinator, Clint Garza, and a number of other Hays County staff have spent the past year working with all parties trying to make sure this development meets all our rules and is designed to be the best it can be.

City of Austin has water quality authority/regulations and some other authorities granted by state law that Counties do not have. Mr. Nemec unfortunately has been somewhat "ping-ponged" between the primary governing entities (Hays/COA), and in my experience has shown a willingness to meet our rules and even go beyond in a number of instances. The City of Austin rules are more stringent by effect of legislative authority, and I believe Mr. Nemec and his team continue to work to meet those requirements.

We are aware of the 20-foot emergency access easement that has been the topic of concern recently. While not a Hays County requirement in this case, we do agree to its necessity with a subdivision of this size and only one ingress/egress point. Travis County was asking for a second public access, but in the end agreed to the locked, emergency-only easement. Chad Nemec argued for this and was true to his word regarding no through access to Trail Driver. In and effort to make all have some comfort level with this emergency easement, the developer has agreed to expand the subdivision plat notes to the effect it will never be a public ROW, only an emergency only access easement. I support this type of safety easement, and can only hope it will never be needed for Blackstone or for Big Country.

This afternoon I spoke with the developer's representative, Rick Vaughn, and asked him to look in to the citing of the easement, referring him to your concern over ditch and slope issues off Trail Driver. I should hear back from him tomorrow and will provide info when I get it.

Just so you will know, Hays County will soon adopt new development regulations that have been almost three years in the making. Our current subdivision rules were adopted in 1997. Considerable public input and debate have occurred in our rulemaking, and we look forward to having a revised set of regs that will provide comprehensive and clear direction for development. There is also provision in the new rules for enhanced public notice and input with regard to development. You expressed some frustration on that front, with neighbors just "not knowing" what was going on. While I believe Mr. Nemec has been communicative and shared his plans with members of your neighborhood, more information is always needed and desired.

Please let me know if you have any further questions. I'll be in the office Th morning and glad to address any further concerns.

We are very concerned with the over saturation of multiple lots with septic systems, possibly contaminating our well and our neighbors. Have there been any studies done on the concentrated levels of multiple waste systems close to people's wells? We would like to be assured that there is no possibility any contamination could happen to our water.

Also, we would like to see the developer as a good will and neighborly gesture, leave a greenbelt buffer/easement along the fence line between our properties. We feel this will help us keep from loosing property value and desirability for future resale, by continuing to maintain an uninterrupted view that provides the privacy and quality of living our Hill Country home and property has provided for the past, present and the future years.

STATE OF TEXAS §

COUNTY OF TRAVIS §

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Blackstone Vineyard Development, LLC, (the "Developer"), and Travis County, Texas, (the "County"), hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties", for the purposes and consideration stated herein.

WHEREAS, the Developer is in the process of subdividing that certain 209.52 acre tract of land described in Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Developer desires to develop the Property in phases; and

WHEREAS, it is contemplated that the Developer will subsequently submit final subdivision plats for other portions of the Property for County approval in accordance with the approved Preliminary Plan for Blackstone Vineyard, (the "Preliminary Plan"), dated , ; and

WHEREAS, the Developer and the County desire to provide for the orderly development of the remainder of the Property, including:

a) the improvement of Fitzhugh Road (the Street(s)) with a left turn lane once 51 lots are to be final platted which will provide interior access to and through the Property; and

WHEREAS, the development of the Property will necessitate the construction of the Street(s) and/or impact the Road; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to establish a process to coordinate the improvement of the Street(s) and the Road with the phased development of the Property;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and the promises contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1) In the phased development of the Property, the Developer will:
- a) upon the execution of this Agreement, dedicate or cause to be dedicated by plat or separate instrument the additional right-of way and any required slope or drainage easements necessary for:
 - I) the construction or the upgrade of the Streets within the

Phase being final platted and any additional portion of the Street(s) required to provide access to the Phase being final platted, as shown on Exhibit "B", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and/or

- II) the upgrade of the Road adjacent to the Property being final platted, as shown on Exhibit "B"; and
- b) as the Phase of the subdivision with more than 51 lots of the Property is submitted to the Commissioners Court for approval, post, under a County-approved form:
 - I) the construction security for the cost of the improvements to the Street(s) within the Phase being final platted and any additional portion of the Street(s) necessary to provide access to such Phase;
- 2) In the phased development of the Property, the County will, subject to the performance by the Developer of its obligations under this Agreement and the Travis County Standards for Construction of Streets and Drainage in Subdivisions, approve the subsequent final subdivision plats of the Property.
- 3) Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, if the County initiates a project to improve any portion or all of the Street(s) and/or Road, including that portion of the Road which is adjacent to the Property, the Developer will:
- a) have the obligation to pay for the improvement of the Street(s) within the Property; and/or
- b) continue to have the obligation to post construction security pursuant to this Agreement.

If such fiscal is received after the County has begun or has completed the contemplated improvements, the fiscal will be in the form of cash and be used to reimburse the County for the actual costs of constructing the Street(s) and/or Road improvements, including that portion of the Road which is adjacent to the Property.

- 4) The right-of-way and any slope or drainage easement dedications, which must be dedicated under this Agreement, shall be in an approved County form and must be free from any encumbrances, conditions, restrictions, rights, or interests, which may, in the reasonable opinion of the County Attorney's Office, adversely affect the County's ability to use the right-of-way or easements for their intended purpose.
- 5) The presently estimated cost of constructing the left turn lane improvements to:
- a) the Phase with more than 51 lots within the Property is:

- 6) If the Developer submits a final plat(s) for a portion of a Phase of the Property or if the Preliminary Plan for the Property is revised and approved, the County and the Developer will, to the extent required, either amend this Agreement or enter into an additional or supplemental agreement(s) to coordinate the phasing process and the future improvement of the Street(s) and/or Road.
- 7) The County and its officers, employees, and successors and assigns will not be liable or responsible for and shall be held harmless by the Developer from any claims, losses, damages, causes of action, suits and liability of any kind for personal injury or death or property damage arising out of or in connection with any actions by or negligence of the Developer under the terms of this Agreement.
- 9) Miscellaneous.
- a. Beneficiaries. This Agreement will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their successors and assigns.
- b. Restrictive Covenant. This Agreement touches and concerns real property located in Travis County, Texas, and, if recorded, will constitute a covenant running with the land. However, this Agreement will not affect the title to the land conveyed to purchasers of individual lots in a Phase of the Subdivision, who will take their interests free and clear of the conditions of this Agreement without the necessity of any release or consent by the County.
- c. Amendment to Agreement. Any revision, modification, or amendment of this Agreement will be effective only when reduced to writing and signed by the County and the current owners of the affected portion(s) of the Property which is affected. NO OFFICIAL, AGENT, OR EMPLOYEE OF THE COUNTY HAS ANY AUTHORITY, EITHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED TO AMEND OR MODIFY THIS AGREEMENT EXCEPT PURSUANT TO SUCH EXPRESS AUTHORITY AS MAY BE DELEGATED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT.
- d. Assignment by the Developer. The rights, duties, and responsibilities of the Developer may be assigned only with the consent of the County, which will not be unreasonably withheld or unduly delayed.
- e. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This is the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. As of this date, there are no other agreements or representations, oral or written, between the Parties in conflict with this Agreement.

f. Notice. Any notices hereunder will be in writing and addressed to the respective party at the address set forth below for such party, (i) by personal delivery, (ii) by U.S. Mail, certified or registered, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or (iii) by FedEx or other nationally recognized overnight courier service. Notice deposited in the U.S. Mail in the manner hereinabove described will be effective on the earlier of the date of actual receipt or three days after the date of such deposit. Notice given in any other manner shall be effective only if and when received by the party to be notified.

Proposed Motion:

Consider and take appropriate action on a request to approve the addition of a 2009 Kubata Tractor L3400 and associated maintenance to TNR fleet to support a revised CAPCOG Grant Project for food waste composting at the Del Valle Correctional Facility, in Precinct 4

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

The CAPCOG grant (\$28,653) for food waste composting at the Del Valle Correctional Facility was approved in March 2009 but due to problems cited below the grant was revised on April 28, 2009.

The grant originally was to use contracted services to place a 20-yard container to hold food waste at the facility and for cost to haul waste once a week to a composting facility. These plans had to be modified because of increased costs for transportation and the rental of the container. The grant could nor sustain the increased costs.

After extensive re-evaluation, the project was modified to compost in-house using inmates and additional equipment requested herein for the same cost of the original grant amount. The revised project will actually serve us better in the long run by educating inmates and using the compost ourselves. TNR staff will conduct classes for inmates interested in composting and home gardens. The classes will emphasize the benefits of making one's own compost and growing vegetables. Composting on site also makes the project more sustainable.

Under the revised plan Del Valle inmates will learn about composting and sheriff officers will use a tractor to turn the compost piles in a bin system to the animal composting program currently in use by the county for deer kill on county roads. The compost will be used for new

tree/bush planting and will be available to other County departments such as TNR and Facilities Management.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact

The TNR fleet manager has estimated the fuel and maintenance costs to be less than \$3,000 a year (see attached) to be budgeted through TNR beginning in FY 2010. The grant will pay the maintenance costs of approximately \$750 for the remainder of FY 2009 (July, August, September).

Issues and Opportunities

This effort is in support of the Travis County letter to Mayor Wynn (dated May 13, 2008) stating support for the City's goal of achieving zero-waste. If this program does not proceed, approximately 5,000 pounds of food waste a month will continue going to the landfill.

Project Description:

Funding will be used to implement a food waste and compostable item diversion program at the Del Valle Jail in Travis County. This project supports the goals and objectives of the regional plan by encouraging effective and efficient management and operation of recycling services and reducing the amount of municipal solid waste generated and disposed of within the region. Funds will be used to purchase containers for food waste, compostable food trays, and other compostable items. Containers will then be emptied into a centralized 20-yard container, and funds will be used to subcontract for weekly hauling of the 20-yard container to a centralized composting facility. Funds will also be used to provide travel and registration fees for Travis County employee Charles Williams to attend the US Composting Council Conference in Houston, Texas, in January 2009. Charles Williams will support implementation of this project by training Del Valle Jail staff and inmates in program operation, coordinating purchase and use of compostable service items, and troubleshooting implementation of the program, with the goal of achieving revenue neutral status at the end of one year.

Revision 1

The project manager has discerned that this program requires use of a sealed compacting container, as opposed to regular 20-yard containers, for health and safety reasons. There is not an appropriate electrical outlet available where the compactor will be located, and so one must be installed. Travis County requests that \$5,500 of their project budget be used to install appropriate electrical connections.

Revision 2

Since the original quotation from Texas Disposal Systems (TDS) was received, TDS has increased their proposed cost for dumpster rental and hauling to \$40,000 per year. This cost will not be sustainable beyond the grant period. The project manager and officials at the Del Valle Jail have revised their program to eliminate the contractual services. Inmates will operate the composting project in-house, requiring equipment to turn and move the compost product. Compost will be used on Travis County projects and properties only. Travis County has a composting notification in place for this site due to a previous composting project at the same location. The program will include two educational sessions per month to be taught by the project manager, who is also a Master Composter, as part of the Del Valle Jail inmate education program.

Summary and TNR Staff Recommendation:

The old 60' right of way of Quinlan Park Road has been accepted for maintenance since 1932. Based on the Steiner Ranch Master Roadway Phasing Agreement, the original developers, T.H. L. Ranch Ltd. and 521 Development Ltd. agreed to rebuild Quinlan Park Road in segments or phases, realigning or widening the road in places. The vacation and acceptance of the adjusted right of way was approved in Commissioners Court on February 1, 2005. The width of the right of way for this section is 90'.

Phase One was constructed as a County Project, funded by the developers. The construction improvements for Phase Two, Three and part of Phase Four were accepted for maintenance on February 22, 2005. We are ready to accept the new construction improvements for the balance of Quinlan Park Road to its intersection with Selma Hughes Park Road.

The project has been inspected for conformance with approved plans and specifications as listed. The sidewalks have been inspected by Able2Access, Inc. and found to be in substantial compliance.

Although we are asking for the Court's acceptance of the new improvements, this action is not really adding 0.66 miles to the Travis County road system, because Quinlan Park Road is accepted for maintenance now. It is really accepting the widening of the road from 20' to 40' face to face of curb and gutter and adding sidewalk on the west side of the road down to its intersection with Selma Hughes Park Road. TNR staff recommends acceptance of the construction improvements for this portion of Quinlan Park Road, as described in the Acceptance of Dedication of Streets and Drainage List of Streets, and the release of the fiscal.

SUBJECT: B. Third Amendment to Steiner Ranch License Agreement, for Phase 4B Landscape Improvements.

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

The original License Agreement was approved in Commissioners Court on September 19, 2000. It is for the maintenance and liability of private improvements in the right of way of Quinlan Park Road from RM 620 to Quinlan Park Road's first intersection with Steiner Ranch Boulevard. A second License Agreement was approved in Commissioners Court on May 14, 2002, for Phase 2 of Quinlan Park Road, from the first crossing of Steiner Ranch Blvd. to the second crossing of Steiner Ranch Boulevard. A First Amendment to that License Agreement incorporated both of the previous License Agreements and added the area along Quinlan Park Road known as Phase 3 and part of Phase 4 (or 4A). The Second Amendment added the area along the portion of Steiner Ranch Boulevard between RM 620 and Quinlan Park Road.

The request today is to accept a Third Amendment to the License Agreements for improvements in Quinlan Park Road from the southern boundary of Steiner Ranch Phase 1 Section 9 to Selma Hughes Park Road. TNR staff recommends approval of the Third Amendment to the License Agreement.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impacts:

The Amendment to the License Agreement is for private improvements in the right of way of Quinlan Park Road to be maintained by the Steiner Ranch Master Association, Inc. The association has given an additional Security Deposit of \$12,508.10, bringing the total Security Deposit to \$65,000 for all of the improvements that they maintain in Quinlan Park Road and the portion of Steiner Ranch Road from RM 620 to Quinlan Park Road.

Issues and Opportunities:

In regards to the proposed License Agreement, "...the ASSOCIATION agrees to and shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the COUNTY and its officers, agents and employees against all claims, suits, demands, judgments, expenses, including attorney's fees, or other liability for personal injury, death, or damage to any person or property, which arises from or is in any manner connected to or caused in whole or in part by the ASSOCIATION's construction,

maintenance or use of the Licensed Property." The Steiner Ranch Master Association, Inc. (the "ASSOCIATION") has provided insurance that adds Travis County as an additional insured for the improvements as described in the attached Agreement. We do not foresee any opposition to this action.





THIRD AMENDMENT TO LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN TRAVIS COUNTY AND THE STEINER RANCH MASTER ASSOCIATION, INC.

This Third Amendment to License Agreement (the "Third Amendment") is made and entered into by and between the County of Travis, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "County"), and the Steiner Ranch Master Association, Inc. (the "Association") (the County and the Association hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties") and is as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into that certain <u>License Agreement</u>, recorded as Document No. 2000171148, Document No. 2002108363 Document No. 2000171148 and, in the Official Records of Travis County, Texas ("**License Agreement**") for the installation and maintenance of certain landscaping and improvements in portions of the right-of-way of Quinlan Park Road, also know as Phase 1 and Phase 2, respectively, and which runs through the Steiner Ranch development;

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into that certain <u>First Amendment to License Agreement</u>, recorded as Document No. 2005047359, in the Official Records of Travis County, Texas (the "**First Amendment**") which added landscaping, irrigation and signage in that portion of the right-of-way of Quinlan Park Road, also known as Phase 3 and 4 Part A (to 16,100' south of FM 620); and;

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into that certain <u>Second Amendment to License Agreement</u>, recorded as Document No. 2006192617, in the Official Records of Travis County, Texas (the "**Second Amendment**") which added landscaping, irrigation and signage in that portion of the right-of-way of Steiner Ranch Boulevard, also known as Bull Creek Pump-over, 12" Wastewater Force M, and Steiner Ranch Boulevard Street Improvements, from approximately Sta. 46 +50 to FM 620; and

WHEREAS, the Association has applied for a permit and submitted plans for an extension of landscaping, irrigation, and signage in the right-of-way of a portion of Quinlan Park Road (as more particularly described in that certain Roadway Easement, recorded as Document No. 1999118444, in the Official Records of Travis County, Texas) known as Quinlan Park Road 4B, River Dance Phase 4, and River Dance Phase 5, and therefore desire to modify the Agreement to provide for such additional improvements from approximately Sta. 161+00 to 228+50, such plans for landscaping, irrigation, and signage being depicted on Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the Parties' mutual promises and covenants, and of other good and valuable consideration including additional Security

Deposit (as set forth herein), the receipt, sufficiency, and adequacy of which the Parties mutually acknowledge, the Parties agree as follows and hereby amend the Agreement as follows:


- 1. The Association shall be required to post as the Security Deposit \$65,000.00 in the form of cash, a non-expiring surety bond, or an automatically renewing Letter of Credit (which replaces and releases previously posted Security Deposits). In the event the Association elects to use an automatically renewing Letter of Credit as the Security Deposit, the terms of such Letter of Credit shall state: (i) the Letter of Credit automatically renews on an annual basis, or (ii) the Association or the bank will provide written notice to the County sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of such Letter of Credit.
- 2. Pursuant to this Third Amendment, the following property is added to the definition of Licensed Property: Quinlan Park Road from approximately Sta. 161+00 to 228+50.
- 3. As of the effective date hereof, all terms and conditions of the License Agreement shall, except as hereby amended, remain in full force and effect. In the event of any inconsistencies between this Third Amendment and the License Agreement, the terms set forth in this Third Amendment shall govern and control in all respects.
- 4. This Third Amendment may be executed by the Parties in multiple originals, which shall be construed together as one document, and shall be binding on the Parties upon the signature of each of the Parties.
- 5. This Third Amendment shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, except to the extent the laws of the United States of America shall preempt Texas law, in which case such federal law shall govern and control.
- 6. Any capitalized terms used and not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings set forth in the License Agreement.



Proposed Motion:

Consider and take appropriate action concerning a proposed extension of the current fee schedule for participation under the Balcones Canyonlands Conservation Plan - Shared Vision until September 30, 2009.

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

The Balcones Canyonlands Conservation Plan (BCCP) Citizens Advisory Committee has reviewed public participation in the BCCP and the Participation Certificate fee structure each year since 1998.

In February of this year, the Citizens Advisory Committee recommended and the Coordinating Committee in March approved an extension of the current BCCP participation fee structure from July 14th, 2009 to September 30th 2009. This extension was recommended to allow the Citizens Advisory Committee additional time to evaluate current market trends and land values and make a recommendation for BCCP participation fees for the upcoming year.

Staff supports the recommendations of the Citizen Advisory committee and the Coordinating Committee, and recommends approval of the extension of the current Participation Certificate fee schedule through September 30th, 2009.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact:

No additional costs will be incurred by extending or changing the participation certificate fee schedule.

Issues and Opportunities:

Providing certainty in the BCCP participation fee schedule will promote confidence and continued participation certificate sales which are used to acquire and manage lands for the Balcones Canyonlands Preserve.

Background Information:

The concept of using Participation Certificates to fund completion of the Balcones Canyonlands Preserve was introduced after the failure of the \$45 million dollar Travis County bond election in November 1993. By selling participation certificates to the private sector, the Permit Holders (the City of Austin and Travis County) anticipated generating a revenue stream to fund preserve acquisition and maintenance. The Shared Vision financing plan dated July 18, 1995 was based on a balance of participation certificate funds and Travis County Tax Benefit Financing Plan revenues. The Shared Vision document established an initial fee of \$5,500/acre for occupied golden-cheeked warbler or black-capped vireo habitat ("zone 1"), and \$2750/acre for habitat that had not been verified as occupied ("zone 2").

Early participation certificate sales lagged behind original *pro forma* projections. Two public workshops were held to receive public comments and recommendations. Workshop participants suggested that a reduction of participation fees would increase participation and thus needed revenues. After receiving recommendation from the BCCP Citizen's Advisory Committee, the Coordinating Committee adopted a temporary one-year fee schedule for direct participation in the BCCP in 1998. The BCCP Coordinating Committee, Austin City Council, Travis County Commissioners Court and the USFWS reviewed and adopted subsequent recommendations concerning the fee structure in each succeeding year.

In 2006, the Citizen's Advisory Committee recommended increasing participation rates due to increasing land costs in western Travis County and a robust development market. Though this was the first fee change in eight years, the 2006 revised habitat fees did not impact applicants' willingness to participate in the BCCP in 2006, 2007 and 2008. Effects on participation seem to be more closely related to the health and vigor of the local economy and the real estate market. From the time the BCCP was initiated in 1996 to 2001 we see an annual increase in applications, PCs issued and revenue income. 2001 saw the High Tech market bust and 9-11, therefore, the graphs reflect these events with a significant drop in all three indicators (applications, PCs and revenue). The following years we see again an increasing trend as the local and national economy rebounded. FY06 through FY08 saw more revenue collected through the BCCPs public participation program than any year since the permit's issuance along with increases in applications received and PCs issued despite increases in mitigation fees the last three years.

The following table summarizes the changes to the BCCP fees since the inception of the plan:

As the fee structure was established in the 1996 Interlocal Agreement between the City and the County, any Coordinating Committee action to change the fees or extend current fees must be approved by Austin City Council and the Travis County Commissioner's Court. Austin City Council approved the Coordinating Committee recommendation on May 21, 2009. Without Commissioners Court approval of the BCCP Coordinating Committee action before July 15th, the current mitigation fee schedule will expire and fees will revert to the 1996 mitigation rates.

Whereas... the Canyonlands Coordinating Committee recommends extending the current fee structure for participation in the Balcones Canyonlands Conservation Plan (BCCP);

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TRAVIS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT APPROVES THE REVISED FEE STRUCTURE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE BALCONES CANYONLANDS CONSERVATION PLAN AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. From July 15, 2009 to September 30, 2009, the fee for simple participation in the Plan based on the BCCP fee zone map shall be as follows:
 - (a) \$5,500/acre in Zone 1 Golden Cheek Warbler Habitat,
 - (b) \$2,750/acre in Zone 2 Golden Cheek Warbler Habitat,
 - (c) \$5,500/acre in Black Capped Vireo Habitat,
 - (d) \$1,000/acre in Karst Zones 1 and 2,
 - (e) \$2,000/acre for Single Family Lot provision Fee, and
 - (f) \$1,500/acre for the Agricultural Provision Fee.
- 2. From July 14, 2009 to September 30, 2009 the fee for participation through the alternative method, shall be \$6,500 per acre. The fee shall be calculated on United States Fish and Wildlife Services (USFWS) determination of take—both indirect and direct—multiplied by the appropriate habitat quality factor.
- 3. When land within the Preserve, or land which has been determined by USFWS to be acceptable as part of the Preserve, is offered as mitigation in lieu of payment of the fee using the alternative approval method, USFWS shall determine the amount of mitigation credit that is received for land offered in mitigation.
- 4. This revised fee schedule will become effective upon certification of approval by USFWS and will expire on September 30, 2009.



Summary and Staff Recommendation:

The Spanish Oaks, Golf Villas subdivision was recorded October 17, 2007 at Document #200700308. The Preserve Condominiums and Lodge is a site plan project constructed on Lots 2 and 3, Block A of Spanish Oaks, Section 9. Section 9 was recorded May 9, 2007 at Documents #200700146 with Commissioners Court being notified of its construction on June 9, 2009. A TNR Inspector has given these projects Construction Approval. All other items required for Approval of Construction have been received, including the Certificate of Incorporation and Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions, showing that there is a body in place to take over maintenance of the private roadways.

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

The developer of the subject subdivision requests to have the plat held in abeyance while the street and drainage facilities are constructed. The developer also requests the use of a Cash Security Agreement with Travis County for the purpose of posting the Alternative Fiscal. TNR staff recommends approval of the proposed motion.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impacts:

There are no budgetary and/or fiscal impacts. Fiscal is posted for restoration of disturbed areas should construction not be completed. Fiscal will be posted as a Cash Security Agreement.

Issues and Opportunities:

Under Alternative Fiscal the Executive Manager of TNR holds the plat in abeyance and, upon completion of the items listed below, the Executive Manager authorizes the issuance of a Basic Development Permit for construction of streets and drainage facilities.

Plat Status

Construction Plans and Engineer's Estimate of Construction Cost Approved

This subdivision is not in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of any city. All construction plan comments, by Travis County staff, have been addressed and the reviewer is prepared to sign cover sheet of plans, which describe the improvements, and issue Permit #08-0909. The estimated cost of the improvements includes all costs related (including temporary erosion controls, etc.) to construct all streets and drainage facilities. The current estimate of the street and drainage construction cost for all internal improvements is \$171,722.00.

TO THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS:

The undersigned Owner proposes to subdivide that certain tract of land more particularly described in **Exhibit "A"**, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. The Owner requests that Travis County's Transportation and Natural Resources Department ("TNR") hold the proposed plat of land in abeyance until all of the proposed subdivision improvements have been constructed to Travis County Standards for the Construction of Streets and Drainage in Subdivisions (the "Standards") to the satisfaction of the Executive Manager of TNR. In order to qualify for this Alternative Fiscal Policy, the proposed subdivision must meet the access criteria set forth in the Standards.

Under this Policy, the Owner is not required to post fiscal Security to secure the construction of the Improvements, but is required to obtain a Travis County Development Permit. The owner will be required to post fiscal for boundary streets improvements if they are not to be completed during the construction of the Improvements. Additionally, the Owner shall file Security with the submitted Final Plat to secure restoration of disturbed areas should construction not be completed.

Upon satisfactory completion of the Improvements, the submitted plat shall be forwarded by TNR to the Commissioners Court for approval and recording.

If the Owner elects to proceed under this option, the Owner acknowledges and agrees that, until the plat is filed, the Owner may not use the proposed subdivision's description in a contract to convey real property, unless the conveyance is expressly contingent on the recording and approval of the final plat and the purchaser is not given the use or the occupancy of the real property before the recording of the final plat, under penalty of prosecution under Section 12.002 of the Texas Property Code. In addition, the approval of Alternative Fiscal in no way constitutes approval of the proposed plat.

If the plat is to be approved and filed, the Owner must post Security in the amount of 10% of the cost of the completed Improvements to secure the performance of the construction of the Improvements for one year from the date of the approval of the plat and acceptance of the construction by the County.

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



PROPOSED MOTION:

Consider and take appropriate action on:

- A. Entrada Subdivision Preliminary Plan in Precinct Two (Preliminary Plan 841 Lots 234 Acres Immanuel Road Fiscal is not required with the preliminary plan Sewage service to be provided by the City of Austin City of Austin ETJ).
- B. Approve a Phasing Agreement for the Entrada Subdivision Preliminary Plan

SUMMARY AND STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

This preliminary plan subdivision consists of 841 total lots (821 residential lots (163 standard lots and 658 small lots), 17 open space/detention facility/public utility easement lots, two commercial/retail lots, and one private park lot). Fiscal is not required with this preliminary plan. There are 29,215 linear feet of public streets proposed with this plan. Parkland dedication or fees in lieu of dedication are not required with the preliminary plan and will be satisfied with each final plat.

As this preliminary plan meets all Travis County standards and has been approved by the City of Austin Zoning and Platting Commission, TNR staff recommends approval of the preliminary plan and phasing agreement.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

Notification

Notification of filing of this preliminary plan application and its hearing at the City of Austin's Zoning and Platting Commission (ZAP) was mailed to all current owners of property and all registered neighborhood associations within 300 feet of the proposed subdivision. These addresses were obtained from the Travis Central Appraisal District current tax rolls. Single Office records show that all property owners that are required to be notified under Title 30 were notified. In addition, the Single Office has registered two interested parties for this application who have been mailed master comment reports and notices for the administrative decisions made concerning the preliminary plan.

The applicant also sent notice to all neighborhood associations and property owners associations within 1,000 feet, the local emergency service district (ESD), and the Travis County Fire Marshal, notifying the recipients of the proposed non-residential land use (i.e., the two commercial/retail lots near the main entrance to the proposed subdivision)(please see attached).

Transportation

As part of the preliminary plan application, the applicant completed a Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA). The TIA was reviewed by Travis County transportation reviewers and traffic engineers. In the TIA, the traffic growth was estimated based on traffic counts available from the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) from which forecasts were derived. Typically, major intersections within the study area are chosen for analysis that would be most impacted by the development to identify potential improvements. Travis County staff have reviewed the study and have approved the conclusions and recommendations outlined therein.

Improvements to the surrounding infrastructure, based on the recommendations in the TIA, include the developer to post 22% of the cost of signalization improvements at Immanuel Road and Howard Lane and 56% of the cost of signalization improvements at Immanuel Road and Hymill Drive with the final plat that contains the 350th residential lot. Since Immanuel, Howard, and Hymill roads are considered county roads, the recommended improvements adjacent to the proposed subdivision are outlined in a Phasing Agreement (Item B) entered into by Travis County and the developer based on the phases of the development (please see attached). As the phasing agreement involves Travis County roads, the preliminary plan could be acted upon by the Zoning and Platting Commission prior to the County executing this agreement. In the phasing agreement, the owner shall post fiscal security prior to final plat approval in a form and amount satisfactory to the County for the improvements adjacent to the proposed subdivision.

Emergency Services Review

The local emergency service provider, Emergency Services District #2, does have review authority of preliminary plans. ESD #2 approved the proposed layout of the subdivision as drawn.

FEMA/CLOMR

The applicant is proposing to modify the current Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) floodplain along two unnamed tributaries of Gilleland Creek that traverse the property. As part of the preliminary plan application to the Single Office, the applicant has submitted a complete application for a Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR) to FEMA for their technical review. The purpose of the CLOMR application is to receive FEMA's input on the proposed development's impact on the floodplain prior to approval of any final plats. The CLOMR application will be reviewed for correctness by FEMA. For a preliminary plan to be presented to the Zoning and Platting Commission and Commissioners' Court, the CLOMR application must be complete only – FEMA is responsible for certifying that it is correct.

Water/Wastewater

The applicant has received approved Service Extension Requests (SER) from the City of Austin for water and wastewater services to proposed development.

Waivers/Variances

The applicant has satisfied the requirements of Title 30 to be granted an administrative waiver to 30-2-34 (Balance of Tract) and an administrative waiver to 30-2-153 (Block Length).







ENTRADA SUBDIVISION PHASING AGREEMENT

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF TRAVIS

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between H.M. Pfluger, Ltd. (the "Developer"), and Travis County, Texas, (the "County"), hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties", for the purposes and consideration stated.

WHEREAS, the Developer is in the process of subdividing the tract of land described in Exhibit "A", which is attached (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, it is contemplated that the Developer will subsequently submit Final Plats for other portions of the Property for County approval in accordance with the Preliminary Plan for Entrada Subdivison, (the "Preliminary Plan"), File # C8J-2008-0168; and

WHEREAS, the Developer and the County desire to provide for the orderly development of the Property and to allow for Project Phasing and the creation of dual access points to public roads; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to establish a process to coordinate the improvement and connection of public roadways within the phased development of the Property;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the promises contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. In the phased development of the Property, the Developer submit to Travis County Transportation and Natural Resources Department, Final Plat(s) and construction drawings for the infrastructure within that phase on development.
- 2. The Developer shall construct the infrastructure for no more than 350 single family residential lots without at least two points of public access being provided. Points of public access as shown on attached Exhibit "B", shall be defined as either:
 - a. The connection of proposed Entrada Tranquila Way to existing Wells Branch Parkway, or
 - b. The connection of Louris Lane to Immanuel Drive, or
 - c. The connection of Louris Lane through the approved Cantarra Subdivision to Cantarra Drive.
- 3. The Developer acknowledges that the development of the Property is subject to the terms contained in the Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) for Entrada Subdivision as prepared by Robert Halls & Associates, Inc. and as reviewed and approved by Travis County Transportation and Natural Resources Department. Per the Traffic Impact Analysis:

The Developer shall post 22% of the cost of signalization improvements at Howard Lane/Immanuel Road intersection with the final plat that includes the 350th single family residential lot in the overall subdivision.

The Developer shall post 56% of the cost of signalization improvements at Hymill Drive/Immanuel Road intersection with the final plat that includes the 350th single family residential lot in the overall subdivision.

- 4. In the phased development of the Property, the County will, subject to the performance by the Developer of its obligation under this Agreement and the Travis County Standards for Construction of Streets and Drainage in Subdivisions, approve the subsequent Final Plats of the Property.
- 5. Any right-of-way and any slope or drainage easement dedications, which must be dedicated under this Agreement, shall be in an approved County form and must be free from any encumbrances, conditions, restrictions, rights, or interest, which may, in the reasonable opinion of the County Attorney's Office adversely affect the County's ability to use the right-of-way or easements for their intended purposes.
- 6. If the Developer submits a Final Plat(s) for a portion of a Phase of the Property or if the Preliminary Plan for the Property is revised and approved, the County and the Developer will, to the extent required, either amend this Agreement or enter into an additional or supplemental agreement(s) to coordinate the phasing process and the future improvement of roadways.
- 7. The County and its officer, employers, successors and assigns will not be liable or responsible for and shall be held harmless by the Developer from any claims, losses, damages, causes of actions, suits, and liability of any kind for personal injury or death or property damage arising out of or in connection with any actions by or negligence of the Developer under the terms oft his Agreement.

8. Miscellaneous

- a. Beneficiaries. This Agreement will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their successors and assigns.
- b. Restrictive Covenant. This Agreement touches and concerns real property located in Travis County, Texas, and, if recorded, will constitute a covenant running with the land. However, this Agreement will not affect the title to the land conveyed to purchasers of individual lots in a Phase of the Subdivision, who will take their interests free and clear of the conditions of this Agreement without the necessity of any release or consent by the County.
- c. Amendment to Agreement. Any revision, modification, or amendment of this Agreement will be effective only when reduced to writing and signed by the

County and current owners of the affected provision(s) of the Property which is affected. NO OFFICIAL, AGENT, OR EMPLOYEE OF THE COUNTY HAS ANY AUTHORITY, EITHER EXPRESS, OR IMPLIED TO AMEND OR MODIFY THIS AGREEMENT EXCEPT PURSUANT TO SUCH EXPRESS AUTHORITY AS MAY BE DELEGATED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT.

- d. Assignment by the Developer. The rights, duties, and responsibilities of the Developer may be assigned only with the consent of the County, which will not be unreasonably withheld or unduly delayed.
- e. Entire Agreement. This is the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. As of this date, there are no other agreements or representations, oral or written, between the Parties in conflict with this Agreement.
- f. Notice. Any notices hereunder will be in writing, and addressed to the respective party at the address set forth below for each party, (i) by personal delivery, (ii) by US Mail, certified or registered, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or (iii) by FedEx or other nationally recognized overnight courier service. Notice deposited in the US Mail in the manner hereinabove described will be effective on the earlier of the date of actual receipt or three days after the date of such deposit. Notice given in any other manner shall be effective only if and when received by the party to be notified.

- i. Number and Gender. All terms or words in this Agreement, regardless of the number or gender in which they are used, shall be deemed include any other number or gender as the context may require.



Summary and Staff Recommendation: Staff requests the acceptance of the award from the Emergency Food and Shelter Local Board in the amount of \$40,554 for the 2009 ARRA Phase 27 Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) grant period. These funds are being made available due to the recognized greater community need for utility assistance in this area as well as across the Country. This funding will be used to provide emergency utility assistance for individuals and families from Travis County's low-income households who have an income at or below 200% of the current Federal Poverty Income Guidelines. These program funds will operate using the guidelines of the current EFSP grant for utility assistance with the program period as April 1 through December 31, 2009.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact: These ARRA EFSP grant funds will be budgeted in the utility assistance line item established for this fund with a separate project number assigned. No matching funds are required. The current EFSP grant contract period is 01-01-09 through 12-31-09. This amendment will be effective 4-1-09 through 12-31-09.

Issues and Opportunities: The department has participated in this program for a number of years and in the last Emergency Food and Shelter Program period assisted 540 households with their utility bills. Other agencies receiving funds for this program use their funding to provide food, shelter and rental assistance for clients in the Travis County area. Through coordinating efforts with these agencies with regard to their use of funding as well as ours, duplication of services is prevented and assistance is given in a more efficient and effective manner.

We will use all these 2009 Phase 27 ARRA Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds for direct assistance to clients. These funds are used to supplement the Federal, State, County and local grant funds to enable the department to extend utility assistance to indigent individuals and families who seek aid from the department.

The grant allows for a 4% indirect cost allocation for the county and 1% (\$2,395) for the OneStar Foundation. The county is not claiming its 4% allocation because this would raise the cost per FTE above the maximum allowable amount set by the OneStar Foundation.

Consider and take appropriate action to approve an amendment reducing the amount of AmeriCorps grant funds awarded to Travis County in FY'09.

Summary and Staff Recommendations:

The OneStar Foundation administers the AmeriCorps grant which Travis County 4-H CAPITAL uses to expand its after-school programs and summer camps in the Austin Independent School District. The Travis County 4-H CAPITAL AmeriCorps Program has served more than 15,000 area youth since its inception in FY'04. During this time, 91 AmeriCorps members have received career and professional development while contributing more than 112,000 service hours.

The FY'09 AmeriCorps grant runs from 8/1/08 – 7/31/09. Due to an AmeriCorps member leaving before completing her required number of hours, \$1,980 in member stipend money will not be used. This money cannot be used for other grant expenses. The amendment de-obligates the stipend money so that OneStar can use it elsewhere.

TCHHSVS staff recommends approving this amendment.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact:

The FY'09 grant will be reduced from \$230,020 to \$228,040.

Issues and Opportunities:

Studies show that students who participate in after-school programs have fewer behavior problems, handle conflict better, show improved social skills and enhanced academic performance. AmeriCorps members provide much-needed staff to increase the number of after-school programs and summer camps in Travis County as well as enhance existing programs. Travis County 4-H CAPITAL programs differ from more traditional programs by offering hands-on activities that reinforce key concepts in the curriculum.



This week's claims reimbursement request of \$1,023,641.46 includes three claims over \$25,000, totaling \$85,741.85. In addition there are seven claims over \$10,000, totaling \$113,297.68. Travis County will be reimbursed for claims costs for individuals that exceed \$175,000 in the fiscal year. These claims have been audited by HRMD and the individuals are appropriately covered under our health plan.

Also, this week's claims reimbursements include pharmacy charges which are included in reimbursement requests every other week. Pharmacy charges this week of \$302,571.21 are consistent with average bi-weekly pharmacy charges.

In conclusion, it appears this week's reimbursement is higher due to the number of large claims as well as the overall number and amount of claims included.



- Suspend the Bilingual Supplemental Pay Policy; and, reconsider during an improved economic climate
- Authorize the transfer of \$455 to pay for testing completed to date

Available Funding Resources

Potential demand for this program is much higher than originally expected. Departments have indicated they cannot internally fund projected slots for 2010. Some also expressed funding challenges if the program is implemented in FY 2009.

Current County Comparable Organization Practices

HRMD conducted a survey of Travis County comparable organizations. None of the county comparables (Bexar, Dallas, Tarrant, Harris, Williamson) offer any form of Bilingual Pay. The city comparables (Austin, San Antonio, Dallas, Houston, Fort Worth and Round Rock) offer Bilingual Pay to the classified work force. LCRA and UT Austin do not offer Bilingual Pay.

Summary:

Commissioners Court Direction, June 16, 2009

HRMD surveyed departments to assess the total department projected demand for Bilingual Supplemental Pay for FY 2010. Preliminary results were presented to Commissioners Court. Based on Commissioners Court direction on June 16, 2009, HRMD was directed to work with departments to refine the FY 2010 projections; and, to audit a sample of employee files to assess current practices used by departments to compensate bilingual skills.

Comments, Questions, Issues Identified by Departments

- Equity concerns; Decision to not participate rather than select only two (2) slots for FY 2009
- Inadequate internal funds to fully implement based on need and applicability
- Increasing need for use of Spanish bilingual skills
- Two employees selected places pressure to pass test
- Varied pay practices used to compensate bilingualism, e.g. criteria, amount of pay, funding availability, departmental internal testing
- Employees who were initially compensated for bilingual skills are no longer benefiting from the initial increase, e.g. erosion over time given compensation funding policies
- Challenge to resolve inconsistency between policy and existing bilingual pay practices
- Continue existing pay practices to compensate bilingual skill versus a Bilingual Supplemental Pay Policy
- Potential availability of Bilingual Supplemental Pay for additional languages

B. Audit Results - Current Bilingual Supplemental Pay Practices

Bilingual Spanish skill is not a minimum qualification requirement on Travis County job descriptions. Departments have rarely required this skill for any specific position in the job posting and hiring process; however, an increasing number of postings list the skill as preferred.

An audit of a sample of employee files hired during FY 09 reveals there is no consistency in how departments currently determine whether or not to provide additional compensation to new hires or the amount of pay awarded for those possessing bilingual skills. Although the review showed that some employees were hired above the minimum of the pay grade, it was not possible for HRMD to isolate whether employees were specifically

Last Updated 7-2-09 at 2:28pm compensated for bilingualism. Department pay determination practices vary widely and each department would have to confirm whether or not additional compensation was awarded solely for Spanish bilingual skills.

For employees hired after the Employee Matrix was approved (1998) and prior to 2003, departments had the opportunity upon hire to compensate an additional "level" along the pay range for bilingual or other relevant skill. When the County transitioned from the Matrix to the Pay Determination Guide (PDG) in 2003, departments could use the form as a guide to determine new hire pay. Departments that use the PDG look at a combination of factors to make recommendations for starting pay, and unless the department specifically references bilingualism on the PDG, it is not possible to isolate the specific impact of any one factor such as bilingualism.

Varying methods of compensating bilingualism is further supported through feedback received from departments. Discussions and written feedback indicated that some departments currently compensate for bilingual skills, others do not. Methods of compensating bilingual skills vary by criteria, amount of pay, funding availability, departmental internal testing, and other variables. Certain departments award additional compensation to new hires for selected slots regularly using bilingual skills, while others pay almost all new hires having bilingual skills additional compensation under the premise that these employees may be called upon to use the skills on a regular or ad-hoc basis to meet the needs of the business. In addition, some departments administer a departmental bilingual proficiency test and others do not.

Background:

The Commissioners Court approved a Bilingual Supplemental Pay Pilot Program for FY 2009 which includes County funding of a \$65 Spanish Oral Proficiency Skills Test fee for a maximum of two (2) employees per department, for a total of 46 departments x \$65 = \$5,980. Supplemental pay of \$75 per month (\$37.50 per pay period or \$900 annually excluding benefits) per employee is to be internally funded by each participating department. Oral Spanish Proficiency Testing began in June 2009 with forty-six percent (46%) of departments participating to date.

Proposed Motion:

Approve the request from the Texas House of Representatives to allow the Texas House to use Travis County Channel 17 (TCTV-17) for cablecasting the Special Legislative Session that begins Wednesday July 1, 2009 until completion (unknown at this time). The House requests use of channel 17 on Thursdays and Fridays during the session. This requires a waiver of Travis County Policies and Procedures chapter 43, section 004.

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

The Texas House requests that TCTV participate with the City of Austin Channel 6 in broadcasting live 2009 House Special Legislative sessions. The session begins Wednesday July 1, 2009. The House requests TCTV-17 carry the sessions on Thursdays and Fridays, with the City of Austin cable channel 6 carrying the sessions the other days. Further, the House requests the sessions are carried in their entirety.

Some sessions run long and could preempt other TCTV programming. In order to specify the level of participation, TCTV submits the following options and issues to the Court:

- 1. Carry the House sessions on Thursdays and Fridays as requested. (RECOMMENDED)
 - This may conflict with the Commissioners Court Thursday work sessions.
 - TCTV has the capability to allow airing the House session to the public on Channel 17 and simultaneously show regular programming on the County's closed circuit system (channel 12), including live and tape-delay Commissioners Court sessions. The closed circuit broadcast is available to the entire downtown county complex with the exception of the EOB. Additionally, Commissioners Court sessions will be streamed live on the Travis County website, www.traviscountytv.org.
 - Taped Commissioners Court work sessions would be broadcast at 7 p.m. that evening, unless the Texas House session runs past 7pm. The work session would air again at 1 a.m. and 9 a.m. the following morning (Friday), unless there is a live meeting of the Texas House.

- 2. Move Thursday work sessions to Mondays or Wednesdays. Note the potential problem of interrupting the tape-delayed rebroadcast of the Tuesday Commissioners Court Voting Sessions, which happen on Wednesdays from 9:00 AM until completion.
- 3. Limit the daily number of hours channel 17 is allocated to the Texas House.
 - This will eventually result in interruptions of House sessions, which in the past precipitated many telephone calls from angry viewers.
- 4. Decline to cablecast any House session.
 - Unless the House can make other arrangements with another channel, residents would not have the opportunity to view House sessions on Thursdays and Fridays, which will also precipitate many telephone calls from angry viewers.

Background:

TCTV 17 first carried the House sessions in 1995 in conjunction with City of Austin channel 6. TCTV carried the Wednesday and Thursday sessions and the City aired the Monday, Tuesday, and Friday sessions. The AISD channel has carried the Texas Senate since 1997.

TCTV originally limited the House sessions carried on channel 17 to times that did not conflict with Commissioners Court meetings or "Seniorcise With Ruth". TCTV required the House to return channel 17 to normal TCTV programming no later that 5:30 PM.

During the 1997 legislative session, TCTV received several complaints from the viewing public when we interrupted live House sessions to return to regular county programming. In response, the Commissioners Court directed TCTV to allow the House to air their sessions interrupted, until the House recessed for the day.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact:

No additional funding is necessary. No additional commitment of Travis County personnel or equipment is required.

Issues and Opportunities:

To satisfy this request, Commissioners Court must waive Chapter 43, Section 004 of the Travis County Policies and Procedures which requires TCTV 17 programming to focus on "the educational, cultural, civic, and recreation needs and interests of Travis County".

Request for Additional \$100,000 from Realized CO Savings for East Service Center

Engineering Study and Completion of Remaining Minor Work

Facilities Management Department (FMD) is requesting to transfer realized savings of \$100,000 from the CJC/Gault Renovation Project to complete the East Service Center Project. Both projects are in the Certificate of Obligation issued in FY 08, Fund 510. FMD indicates that the \$100,000 is one-quarter of the savings realized in the CJC/Gault Renovation Project completed earlier this year.

The additional funds will be used to complete the following items:

- \$75,000 for an engineering study of the 100-year floodplain at the East Service Center site required by the City of Austin to issue a permit to open the access road to FM 969. When this project was first conceived, staff in TNR and FMD did not believe that the project would require City of Austin permitting. After the start of construction staff realized that to obtain potable water and electricity connections the project would need to be permitted by the City.
- \$25,000 to cover minor additional work for fire alarm cables needed to finish that portion of the project and for contingency to cover any possible dispute of small tasks by the contractors and additional city requirements that may not be covered in the engineer's proposal (although none are expected). The contingency fund for this project has been expended to within approximately \$2,000.

Given the Commissioners Court's discussion of a purchasing item related to the East Service Center on April 21, 2009, PBO is including an updated funding history for this project for informational purposes. The County Attorney has reviewed this request and has not raised any legal issues related to the transfer within the existing CO. PBO concurs with the request.

The East Service Center Project was completed and dedicated on March 18, 2009. There is a pending permit issue with the City of Austin. Facilities Management obtained the permit from the City of Austin which allows us to connect to the potable water and electricity so that the buildings will be functional and occupied.

A permit from the City of Austin is needed to open the access road of the East Service Center to FM 969. To obtain a permit from the City of Austin, we are required to perform a study of the 100 year flood plain and the creek crossing our property. A quote from our civil engineer is attached which outlined the scope of services needed to be performed in order to obtain the permit from the City of Austin. The engineer's fee is \$75,000. We found out about the City permit for the 100 year flood plain while we were trying to secure a site permit to obtain potable and electricity services. Therefore, to close this project we need to secure the required pending permit from the City of Austin.

In order to secure this funding, I am proposing with the concurrence of PBO and approval of the Commissioners Court, to transfer \$100,000 from a saving on another Facilities Management Project which is the CJC and Gault Project. We have a real saving of \$400,000 on the CJC and Gault Project. Both funds on Eastside Service Center Project and CJC and Gault Project are from Certificate of Obligations.

> Purchasing Recommendation and Comments: Purchasing concurs with the department and recommends approval of requested action. This procurement action compliance requirements as outlined by the statutes.

Exemption order is requested for the procurement of Professional Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing (MEP) Engineering Services for Buildings B155, B185, B188 and B230 at TCCC for HVAC systems upgrade. The Engineering Services will include design of the HVAC systems.

The Travis County Sheriff's Office Senior Engineer, Mark Stefanov, recommends the selection of Page Southerland Page (PSP) to provide MEP Engineering Services. PSP has first-hand knowledge needed for a Correctional Facility and are familiar with the Texas Commission on Jail Standards that specialize in design for inmate housing units. In the past, good engineering judgement has not been adequately used to address items that relate to inmate housing versus normal HVAC design, possibly due to the specialization in jails. This can range from differences for humidity control, required air changes per hour, to integrating HVAC systems with jail smoke evacuation systems. The older buildings being retrofitted were designed by those who did not have this knowledge, which is why the challenge to fix it becomes greater. This requires a Firm and Project engineer who have knowledge on the correct trade offs to make versus starting over with a new building.

Upon the Court's approval of the Exemption Order, TCSO and Purchasing will attempt to negotiate with Page Southerland Page at a fair and reasonable price. TCSO estimates the design for all four buildings will be approximately \$44,000.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS, AND THE LEANDER INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

THIS INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the following parties: Travis County, Texas (the "COUNTY") and the LEANDER Independent School District (the "LISD").

WHEREAS, the LISD and COUNTY, acting through the Travis County Constable's Office of Precinct Two, desire to enter into an interlocal cooperation agreement pursuant to which Constable's deputies will be assigned to LISD campuses as School Resource Officers ("SRO's") under the terms and conditions stated herein:

WHEREAS, the LISD and COUNTY have agreed to a cooperative approach in response to the problems with drugs and alcohol in which the SRO positions are an integral part;

NOW, THEREFORE, the COUNTY and the LISD agree as follows:

I.

- A. The goals of this collaborative effort include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - 1. Provide for the safety of students and staff;
 - 2. Provide problem resolution and enforcement of laws when necessary;
 - 3. Reduce delinquent behavior amongst youth in and around the schools;
 - 4. Prevent and/or reduce incidents of school violence;
 - 5. Form better communication between youth and law enforcement;
 - 6. Establish officers as integral participants in planning efforts related to the Prevention, management, and follow-up efforts related to campus crime response and emergency response;
 - 7. Establish officers as a resource and educational tool for campus / district staff on the recognition and consequences of criminal conduct;
 - 8. Educate youth by providing relevant and informative educational programs.
- B. All law enforcement officers, dispatchers and other personnel, who provide services pursuant to this interlocal cooperation agreement, are employees of the Constable, and the Constable shall maintain supervisory control and command over such employees. This Agreement shall not be construed to constitute an illegal restraint upon or delegation of the Constable's authority with regard to the performance of his/her duties and responsibilities under Texas law.

C. The Constable shall:

- 1. Engage in necessary law enforcement actions.
- 2. Provide for necessary officer supervision and training.

- 3. Provide, if desired, law enforcement related training to students by the officer in subjects agreed upon by Constable Office and LISD personnel.
- 4. Provide for replacement officers for those times when the primary officer assigned pursuant to this Agreement is absent due to extended sick time, vacation time, FMLA, Workers' Compensation, etc. Routine absences may not be covered due to staffing demands within the Constable's Office.

D. Each SRO is responsible for and subject to the following:

- 1. Reports to the campus / district administrator and is subject to assignments and duties and calendar as agreed upon by the campus / district administrator and the Constable.
- 2. Notify the campus / district administration in advance, when possible, regarding absences, court appearances and training.
- 3. During duty hours remain on school campus and attend to school activities.
- 4. Responses to local area law enforcement calls are to be limited to extreme emergencies and observation of criminal acts. Notification of campus administrators will be made upon departure and return when responding to local calls, circumstances permitting.
- 5. Provide the campus / district administration with a copy of activity reports weekly and monthly. This data will then be forwarded to the Constable's Office for compilation and reporting.
- 6. Attend campus meetings, briefings and training as requested by the campus / district administration.
- 7. Assist with the coordination of security for major school events and extracurricular activities.
- 8. Assist school officials in drills and simulations related to crises management, emergency response and threat mediation.
- 9. Perform duties consistent with law enforcement including administrative reports and duties, classroom visits and presentations, traffic enforcement and direction, security monitoring and consulting, investigation of campus crimes, parking lot monitoring, etc.
- 10. Participate in school safe behavior programs as appropriate.
- 11. Maintain confidentiality as it relates to student privacy under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

II.

A. LISD agrees to pay COUNTY, SIX THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED NINETY-THREE AND 33/100 DOLLARS (\$6,293.33) per deputy per month for services rendered by the Constable's Office pursuant to this Agreement, calculated in accordance with the itemization of costs of providing the required services set forth in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Services will be provided from August 15 through June 15 of each year. Any services rendered outside of these dates will be paid

at the deputy's daily rate of pay. Payment for services shall be on a monthly basis, with the months of August and June billed at half the regular monthly rate. The monthly charge includes "straight time" pay only; it does not include overtime pay required when an SRO officer works more than 40 hours in a week pursuant to this Agreement. LISD shall pay for services rendered by the COUNTY from current revenue funds available to LISD.

- B. It is contemplated that ONE (1) full-time deputy will be assigned to provide the law enforcement services described herein and that this deputy shall be assigned to areas as agreed upon by the Constable's Office and the LISD.
- C. In addition to the monthly charge set out in section A above, LISD will be responsible for any overtime charges associated with the provision of services under this Agreement in accordance with the rates set forth in Exhibit "A".
- D. LISD shall pay the COUNTY at the rates set forth in Exhibit "A" for the accrual time spent by any substitute deputy as if they were the standard assigned deputy.
- E. COUNTY shall invoice LISD monthly for the services rendered and the LISD shall pay COUNTY for the services rendered within thirty (30) days of the date the invoice is received by LISD.
- F. The Parties acknowledge that the cost to the COUNTY of providing the services described herein may change over time. Hence, the Parties agree that the COUNTY may change the monthly compensation rates stated in this section II by giving LISD a written Notice of Rate Change delivered in accordance with section IV.B at least sixty (60) days prior to the effective date of the rate change. Such Notice of Rate Change shall include an itemization of costs as set for the in Exhibit "A". If LISD does not desire to continue to receive services at the rates stated in the Notice of Rate Change, it may terminate this Agreement prior to the effective date of the rate change by giving the COUNTY written notice delivered in accordance with section IV.B. If LISD does not terminate this Agreement, LISD will be deemed to have accepted the rate change and shall pay the rates states in the Notice of Rate Change for any services provided by the Constable's Office pursuant to this Agreement on or after the effective date of the rate change.

III.

- A. Initial Term. The Initial Term of this Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and shall continue in full force wand effect through August 14, 2009 and will automatically renew on August 15, 2009 for another year unless sooner terminated by either party in accordance with this Agreement.
- B. Renewal Terms. Subject to continued funding, this Agreement shall thereafter automatically renew each August 15 for subsequent one (1) year periods.

C. Termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement for any reason by giving the other party written notice at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination.

IV.

- A. This is the entire Agreement between the COUNTY and the LISD. No other agreements, statements, or promises relating to the subject matter of this Agreement where are not contained herein shall be valid or binding. This agreement may not be amended, except in writing signed by both parties. NO OFFICIAL, AGENT, EMPLOYEE OR REPRESENTATIVE OF TRAVIS COUNTY HAS ANY AUTHORITY TO ALTER, AMEND OR MODIFY THE TERMS OF THIS CONTACT, EXCEPT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUCH EXPRESS AUTHORITY AS MAY BE GRANTED BY THE TRAVIS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT.
- B. All notices under this Agreement shall be in writing and may be either handdelivered or sent by certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, to the following addresses:

 - A. Salary \$62,949.35, including a base salary of \$46,322.02 and a benefit package of \$16,627.33 per deputy.
 - B. Indirect Personnel Costs \$2,123.80 based on 3.5% of base salary, includes administrative costs of payroll, personnel, fiscal, training, and computer support.
 - C. Supplies: \$4,063.46 per deputy, including cost of uniforms, weapons and office supplies.
 - D. Vehicles: The remaining balance of the current vehicle totalling \$12,333.33, including remaining purchase price of vehicle and associated equipment annualized at a cost of \$3083.33 per year over four years.
 - E. Vehicle Maintenance: \$3,300.00 per vehicle, including fuel, lubricants, and routine maintenance.
 - F. All unexpected costs related to fuel prices will be incurred by LISD.
- II. If any extra deputy is required on a temporary basis, LISD shall reimburse the COUNTY at the following rates: Straight time rate of \$30.26 and overtime rate of \$45.40 per hour.
- III. If an extra patrol vehicle is required on a temporary basis, LISD shall reimburse the County \$20 per hour for the use of the patrol vehicle.



Since the Corporations' financial statements are included as blended component units in the financial statements of the County, we recommend that the Boards of Directors approve the contract with Lockart, Atchley & Associates, LLP ("LA&A") to perform the annual independent external audit services for the Corporations.

In addition, we have reviewed the proposed annual fees and rates for the Corporations and they appear to be reasonable and appropriate for the professional auditing services to be performed.
