## **Chapter 1701 Occupations Code Effective: May 27, 2009**

#### SUBCHAPTER B. POLYGRAPH ADVISORY COMMITTEE

#### Sec. 1703.051. COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP.

(a) The Polygraph Advisory Committee consists of five members appointed by the presiding officer of the commission, with the approval of the commission, as follows:

(1) two polygraph examiner members who are qualified polygraph examiners for a governmental law

enforcement agency;

(2) two polygraph examiner members who are qualified polygraph examiners in the commercial field;

and

(3) one member who represents the public.

(b) A member must have been a United States citizen and a resident of this state for at least two years before the date of appointment.

(c) A polygraph examiner member must be actively engaged as a polygraph examiner on the date of appointment.

(d) Two committee members may not be employed by the same person.

(e) Appointments to the committee shall be made without regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, or national origin of the appointee.

Sec. 1703.054. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Committee members serve staggered six-year terms.

(b) If a vacancy occurs on the committee, the presiding officer of the commission, with the commission's approval,

shall appoint a successor to fill the unexpired term.

Sec. 1703.055. PRESIDING OFFICER. The presiding officer of the commission, with the commission's approval,

shall appoint a member of the committee to serve as presiding officer of the committee for a two-year term.

Sec. 1703.058. COMMITTEE DUTIES. The committee shall advise the commission on:

(1) educational requirements for a polygraph examiner;

(2) the contents of a licensing examination;

(3) technical issues related to a polygraph examination;

(4) the specific offenses for which a conviction would constitute grounds for the department to take action

under Section 53.021; and

(5) administering and enforcing this chapter.
