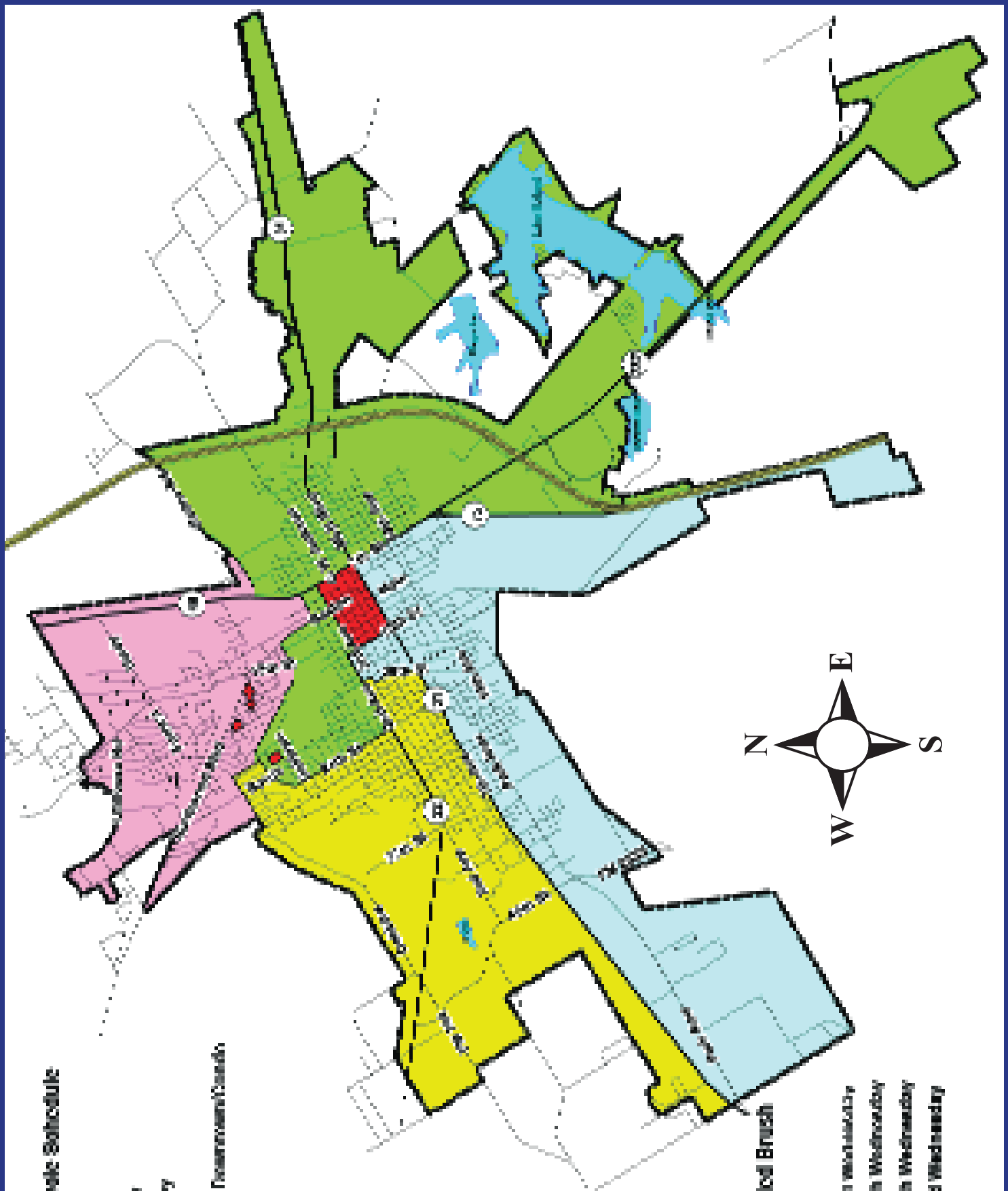
Residential Garbage & Recycling

EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2009

- Polycarts will be delivered to all residential and commercial hand collect addresses prior to the October 1st start date.
- **Garbage pickup will be once per week.** Corsicana as a standard uses the 95-gallon polycart method for waste pickup. Polycart must be placed curbside by 6:30 am on your designated trash day. All solid waste must be bagged or contained. Please call by September 1st to request a second cart for an additional \$4.00 per month. Smaller 65-gallon carts are also available upon request. Requests made after September 1st will be delivered after October 15th.
- **Recycling pickup will be once per week, the same day as your garbage pickup.** (Garbage and Recycle trucks may not necessarily pickup at the same time of day.) Place your recycle cart in the same location as your trash cart. Recycle carts will NOT be delivered unless requested. There is no additional cost to receive one recycle cart. Please call to order a recycle cart by September 1st for delivery. Requests made after September 1st will be delivered after October 15th.
- Polycarts should be at least 3 feet from any object including other polycarts, water meters, gas meters, parked cars, mailboxes, trees, power poles, fences, etc.
- Bulk item pickup is scheduled on a call-in basis. The bulk route will run on Wednesdays each week. Bulk items should be set at the curb no earlier than 5pm on Tuesday. Bulk items sitting at the curb will not be picked up unless called in to schedule removal. Please call Allied Waste at (903) 874-8717
- Please Note: Corsicana has an ordinance in which no garbage may be placed on the curb for collection earlier than 5pm the day before the scheduled collection day. Polycarts must be removed from the curb no later than 10:00pm on the day of collection.
- Allied Waste will run a route to pickup leaves and bundled brush twice per month. Tree trimmings must be cut and bundled in four foot sections. The term "bundle" shall be defined as trees, shrub and brush trimmings securely tied together forming an easily handled package, not exceeding four (4) feet in length or 35 pounds in weight. How Long Will Our Trash Be Around?

Cigarette Butts1-5 years	Nylon fabric30-40 years
Aluminum Cans 500 years	Leather up to 50 years
Glass bottles1,000 years	Wool sock 1-5 years
Plastic bags10-20 years	Orange and banana peels	... up to 2 years
Plastic coated paper5 years	Tin cans 50 years
Plastic film containers	.. 20-30 years	Plastic bottles and Styrofoam	indefinitely

Reasons to Recycle

1. Recycling saves energy and fossil fuels.
2. Recycling saves natural resources.
3. Recycling creates fewer air emissions.
4. Recycling reduces costs through waste diversion.
5. Recycling prolongs the life of our landfills.

Across the country, Republic/Allied Waste's recycling efforts result in an estimated saving of 20 million trees, five billion kilowatt hours of energy and 8.5 billion gallons of water each year. From its 86 recycling centers across the nation, nearly two million tons of recyclables are removed from the waste stream.

Some Helpful Hints:

- Flatten out cardboard boxes. If boxes are large (such as moving boxes or appliance boxes), please cut them into smaller more manageable sizes.
- **NO CAPS OR LIDS PLEASE.** Caps and lids CANNOT be recycled. If left on containers they become dangerous due to pressure build-up when the handling equipment crushes them. They become projectiles and can cause serious injury
- Containers should be rinsed
