Chapter 23

RAILROADS*

Sec. 23-1. Penalty.

Unless stated otherwise, violations of this chapter shall be punished as provided in section 1-8.

Sec. 23-2. Obstruction of crossing.

If any conductor or engineer of any railroad train, or any other person whosoever shall obstruct any street, alley, sidewalk, crossing a thoroughfare of the city by leaving thereon any car, engine, or train, or cars, for a longer time than five (5) minutes or shall stop or cause to be stopped, any railroad engine, car or train or cars across any street, alley, road, highway, or other passageway, so as to obstruct or interfere with the free passage thereon, for a longer time than five (5) minutes, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. Sec. 23-3. Speed.

It shall be unlawful for any train, car or locomotive to be run at a greater rate of speed than thirty (30) miles an hour within the city. Any engineer or conductor having charge of any train, car or locomotive, who shall violate the provisions of this article, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. (Code 1963, Ch. 13, art. 3, § 3 [Ord. No. 76-62, § 1, 10-26-76])
