

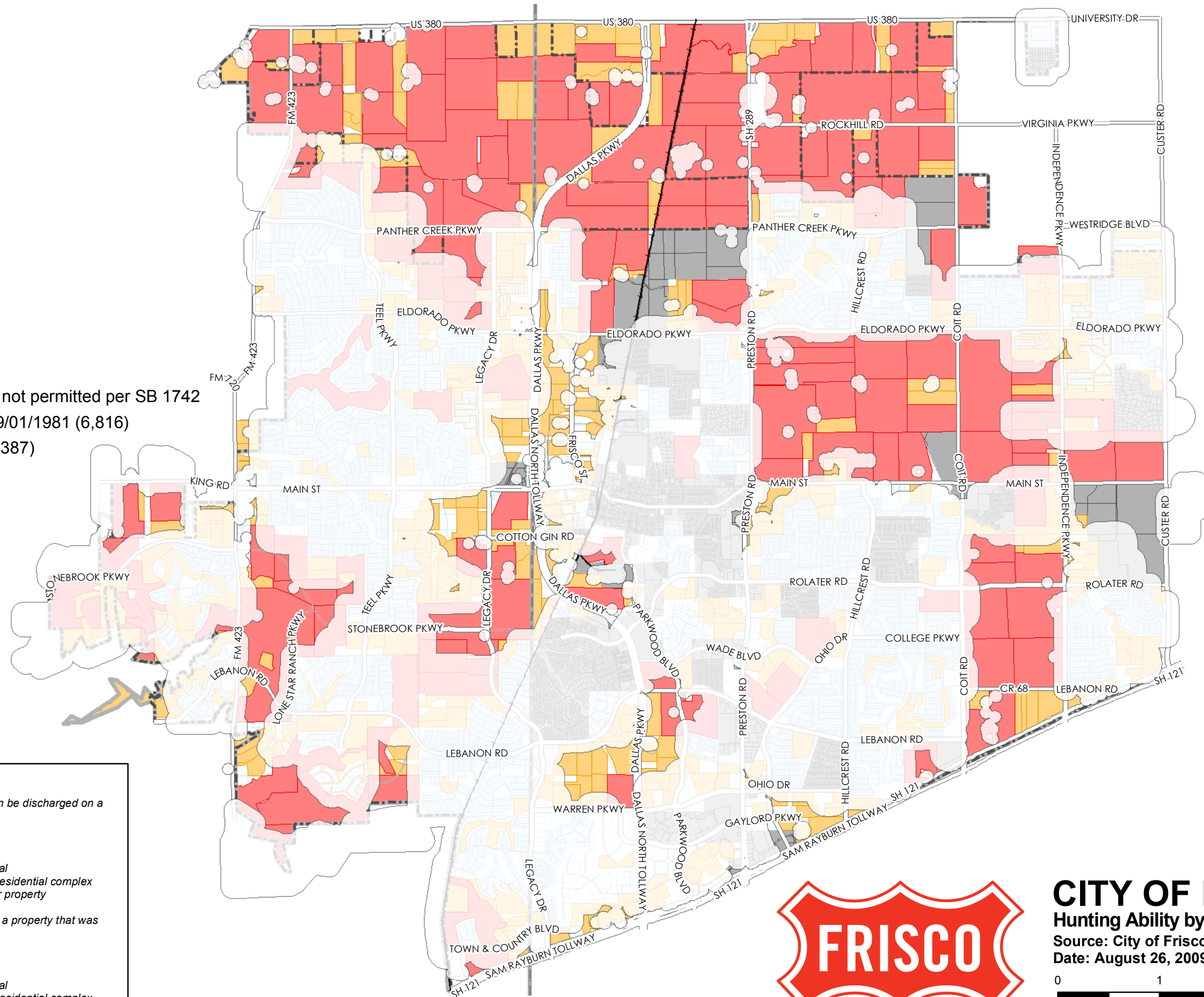

SENATE BILL 1742

A shotgun, air rifle or pistol, BB gun, or bow and arrow can be discharged on a property that was annexed after 9/01/1981 and is:

10 acres or more, and more than:

- 1) 1000 ft from any public land, school, day care or hospital
- 2) 600 ft from any residential subdivision and multifamily residential complex
- 3) 150 ft from a residence or occupied building on another property

A center fire or rim fire rifle or pistol can be discharged on a property that was annexed after 9/01/1981 and is:

50 acres or more, and more than:

- 1) 1000 ft from any public land, school, day care or hospital
- 2) 600 ft from any residential subdivision and multifamily residential complex
- 3) 300 ft from a residence or occupied building on another property
