The Regular City Officer's Election will be held on Saturday, May 10, 2008 for Council Positions 1 and 5, currently held by incumbents David R. Quinn and Warren Driver.

Early voting will begin on April 28, 2008 and end on May 6, 2008, with two late hour, 12-hour voting periods on Tuesday, April 29, and Tuesday, May 6. Early voting begins each day at 7:45 a.m.

The first day to file an Application for Place on Ballot is Monday, February 11 by 5:00 p.m.; the last day to file an Application for Place on Ballot is Monday, March 10, by 5:00 p.m.


How You Can Help Keep Our City Looking Great

As we begin this new year, the City of Tomball's Code Enforcement Officer would like to ensure you are aware of the City's junk vehicle policy. According to the Texas Criminal and Traffic Code, which the City uses as its own guideline, a junk vehicle is any vehicle that is inoperable and has an ex-

pired license plate and motor vehicle inspection certificate. Also, a vehicle is considered to be a junk vehicle if it is wrecked, dismantled, or partially dismantled, discarded, or if it is inoperable and has been that way for a continuous period of more than forty-five (45) days.

Please help the City keep up its appearances by properly storing your vehicles. If you have any questions, or would like to report a junk vehicle, please call our Code Enforcement Officer, Danny Toombs, at 281-290-1470.

Curb Side Pick Up



Garbage collection for the City of Tomball is every Monday and Thursday for residents North of Main Street (except for those in the Tomball Hills, Sherwood Forest, Spring Pines and North Star Subdivisions). If you live South of Main Street, or in the Tomball Hills, Sherwood Forest, Spring Pines and North Star Subdivisions, your collection days are every Tuesday and Friday.

Trash bags are furnished by the City annually and can be picked up at the Public Works building at 501 James St. If residents run out of bags, additional bags can be purchased at the same building. Other plastic bags can be used, but trash cans will not be emptied.

Recycling is picked up on the first garbage collection day of the week. Acceptable materials include newspapers, plastic containers (type 1 or 2 only), and aluminum.

If you have heavy items to be collected, those will be taken on the second collection day of the week. Limbs cannot be longer than 4 feet, and a pile cannot be larger than 4ft. x 4ft. x 4ft. Garbage must be placed at the curb no later than 7:00 a.m. on your collection day.
