The Regular City Officer's Election will be held on Saturday, May 10, 2008 from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm for Council Positions 1 and 5. On the ballot for Position 1 are Derek Townsend and incumbent David R. Quinn. Position 5 candidates are incumbent Warren Driver and David Mayes.

Early voting will begin on April 28, 2008 and end on May 6, 2008, with two late hour, 12-hour voting periods on Tuesday, April 29, and Tuesday, May 6. Early voting begins each day at 7:45 a.m. Both Early Voting and Election Day polling will be at City Hall.

Deadlines to File Residential Protests with Harris County Appraisal District

The deadline for filing residential protests with the Harris County Appraisal District is April 30, 2008 or the date indicated on your appraisal notice. However, homeowners who miss that deadline may still file a protest without penalty until the later of June 2, 2008 or 30 days after the date their appraisal notice is mailed. You may be able to file your protest on-line using iFile at http://www.hcad.org/ifile/.

Development Review Committee

Are you a developer or property owner who needs guidance and direction concerning City of Tomball development policies and requirements? Do you need to speak to city officials about a potential development project? If you are planning a development or a project, please schedule a meeting with the City's Development Review Committee (DRC).



Held every Wednesday from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Public Works Building (501 James Street), the DRC meet-

ings are designed to get you the information you need to make your development or project run as smoothly as possible. These meetings will provide guidelines, timeframes, and rules that must be followed.



Did You Know?

Garbage Service Reminders

City of Tomball Ordinance #82-25 adopted 12-1982, requires all refuse be placed in bags, not cans with a limit of 25 bags per pick-up day. Place your bags at the curbside by 7 AM on your pick-up day. No containers of any type will be emptied. The City's current solid waste contract requires residents to use plastic bags with sufficient strength and cannot exceed 40 pounds.

The City provides free plastic garbage (100 bags per year) to residents, or you may purchase your owns bags. The free bags are available during normal business hours at the Public Works Building at 501 James St. If you are physically unable to take your garbage to your pick-up location, Waste Management provides front-door collection. To see if you qualify for this service or for other questions about your garbage service, please call Public Works at 281-290-1400.
