It's certainly a busy time for the City of Tomball as we continue to work toward the vision of making Tomball a city you can be proud of. Here are just a few things that have happened in since our last newsletter:

- Robert S. Hauck, Tomball's new police chief, started work on June 2 and a public reception was held on June 17 for the chief and his family.
- In the May elections, David Quinn, Councilman Position 1, and Warren Driver, Councilman Position 5, were re-elected to serve three year terms. Mary Harvey, Councilman Position 4, was selected by Council to serve as Mayor Pro-Tem for the next year.
- The first 2nd Saturday at the Depot event was held on June 14. What a great time everyone had! The music, arts and movie were a wonderful way to celebrate the beginning of summer. - We will start the city visioning and comprehensive planning process.

We are looking at economic development studies that will help generate more shopping opportunities for the community.

Did You Know?

5 Ways to Conserve Water

- 1. Check every faucet in the house for leaks. You can waste 15 to 20 gallons a day with a slow drip.
- Use a small drop of food coloring in your toilet to check for leaks. A slow leaking toilet can use 100 gallons a day.
- 3. Don't shower too long or fill the tub too full.
- 4. Try to use automatic dish and clothes washing machines.
- 5. Water wisely. Water early or late in the day, but not in the midday heat.

Tax Collections



Beginning July 1, 2008 the Harris County Tax Office officially took over the collection of all City of Tomball tax payments. Residents can make payments at any Harris County Tax Office including the office located at 101 South Walnut Street, Tomball, TX 77375. Beginning July 21, tax payments may be made online at www.tax.co.harris.tx.us. Payments will no longer be accepted at Tomball City Hall after June 30, 2008. For questions about tax payments, you can call (713) 368-2000.

Online billpay is now available for Tomball utility customers as well as those needing to pay a municipal court fine for which appearance in front of the judge is not required. 
