A Message from The Mayor

We certainly have a lot to be thankful for in Tomball. I would like to thank ALL the people in the Tomball area. After Hurricane Ike roared through town, hundreds of you pitched in to ease the burden for those less fortunate.

We have so many heroes in this town. I would start with our guys in Public Works. They were driving Tomball during the height of the storm and found a gas meter torn out of the ground; they were able (in 80+ mile an hour winds) to turn off the service and prevent a potentially serious situation. These guys worked around the clock the first few days and then cut back to 12 hour days! They cut trees to clear roads for us to get home and then began the huge task of cleaning up our neighborhoods.

Northwest EMS, Tomball fire and police departments and our Public Works crews sheltered and then evacuated the residents of Lawrence Street Nursing Home during the storm. They coordinated this effort with numerous other agencies from around the State. They also safely evacuated the occupants of the Super 8 Motel when the roof came off during the storm.

The congregation at ChristBridge Fellowship opened their doors as a Red Cross Shelter. TISD opened Willow Wood Junior High so the evacuees could have their first shower in five days. The TISD employees not only opened the school, but supervised the kids and took care of babies while the moms got showers. I was not surprised to find that all these TISD employees were without power, yet they were quick to volunteer to help others.

At the FEMA Point of Distribution (POD) site we were able to give food, water and ice to thousands of people in need. Special thanks to the businesses at Four Corners. They understood the emergency and many of them came out to help load the waiting cars, provided ice for insulin, made their bathrooms available and even put up a tent for some of the sunburned volunteers.

Many of our citizens had roof damage, lost trees and we all lost power, but we were blessed in so many ways. We send a big "thank you" to the many volunteers who participated in our United for Tomball Community Cleanup Days. More than 40 properties of senior, disabled and disadvantaged citizens were cleaned up when our city turned out to help those in need.

Even though it sometimes takes a disaster to bring us all together, how we respond says a lot about our community. I am so proud to live in a community where we all come together to make the community better and I'm proud to be your mayor.

Did You Know?

Smoke Detectors Save Lives!

The smoke detector installation program is an ongoing partnership between the City of Tomball Fire Department and Wayne Wright Lawyers of San Antonio. The Wayne Wright Law Firm created the partnership with local jurisdictions in response to a tragic Thanksgiving, 2006 San Antonio house fire in which State Senator Frank Madla and his mother-in-law were killed. The home was not equipped with any working smoke detectors. The law firm was so touched by the tragedy that they developed a program to



make smoke detectors available to any fire department that was willing to spend the time to install them in any home without working detectors.

TFD is very proud to be a partner in that effort. We ask that any resident who does not have a working smoke detector in their home to contact Lisa Griffin at the Tomball Fire Department at 281-351-7101 to arrange for the installation of an appropriate number of detectors.

Who You Gonna Call?



If you are experiencing problems with water, sewer or natural gas at or near your property please call The City of Tomball Public Works Department before calling a plumber. By doing this, you can avoid unnecessary expenses if the repairs are the City's responsibility. The Utility Department has personnel on call 24 hours a day. If you need to contact the Utility Department please call 281-290-1400. After normal business hours please call the Tomball Police Department at 281-351-5451 for the call duty operator.
