#### Stay Warm but Safe this Winter

Each year nearly 36,000 fires are started by portable heaters, fireplaces and chimneys. Winter heating is the second leading cause of home fires.

Please remember that space heaters must be kept at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn; including furniture, blankets, curtains and paper products. To be safe, choose space heaters that turn off automatically if they tip over or get too hot. When using a space heater, please remember that they should never be used to dry clothes and that they should be turned off when you go to bed.

Fireplaces should be inspected by a qualified service person and your chimney or wood stove cleaned each year. Always use a metal or glass fireplace screen to keep sparks from hitting nearby carpets or furniture. Keep air inlets on wood stoves open. Keep kindling, paper and décor away from fireplaces and wood stoves. Never use gas or lighter fluid to start a fireplace or wood stove. Burn only seasoned hardwood. Burning soft, moist wood causes creosote build-up and can cause a chimney fire. Don't burn cardboard boxes, newspaper, or trash. They burn too hot and can cause a chimney fire. Be sure vent pipes extend at least 3 feet above the roof. Install stovepipe thermometers to check flue temperatures. Follow manufacturer's instructions for installing and maintaining fireplaces and wood stoves.

## Spruce up Your Home



This time of year is the perfect time to get a jump start on your Spring cleaning. As we unwind from the holidays, we find numerous opportunities to get a fresh start.

To dispose of your Christmas tree you can place it with your normal trash beginning January 2. Please remember to remove all decorations and stands. Trees should not be placed near water meters, gas meters, or fire hydrants and should not block any drainage systems.

This time of year is also a good time to start some of those tree trimming projects. For proper pruning times and methods you can visit the Texas A&M Horticulture website at

<u>aggie-horticulture.tamu.edu/</u>. If you do choose to trim the trees in your yard, please dispose of the branches and debris properly. Limbs should not be longer than 4 feet in length, and should not be stacked more than 4 feet high or 4 feet wide. Please remember that branches larger than 4 inches in diameter will not be collected.
