2.0 COUNCIL ENTERED INTO A WORKSHOP REGARDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2002-03 BUDGET. MR. GRIFFIN REVIEWED THE MAJOR ISSUES AND THE CAPITAL ITEMS. THE TAX RATE AND GARBAGE RATES WILL REMAIN THE SAME. A 5% INCREASE IN UTILITY RATES IS PROPOSED.

THE CONSENSUS OF COUNCIL IS NOT TO PROCEED WITH THE HIKE AND BIKE TRAILS GRANT. USE THE \$100,000 BUDGETED FOR SOME OTHER IMPROVEMENT IN THE PARKS DEPARTMENT.

MR. GRIFFIN WILL ASK TEDC TO PAY AN EXTRA \$150,000 ON THE SEWER PLANT DEBT SERVICE. THE PLANT WAS BUILT PRIMARILY FOR DEVELOPMENT ON THE CITY=S SOUTHSIDE. COUNCILMAN HOLLAND FELT THE COST OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SHOULD BE BORNE BY FUTURE RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES NOT THE CURRENT TAXPAYERS.

COUNCILMAN GATLIN EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT REDUCTION OF RESERVE FUNDS OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS. RECOMMENDED GUIDELINES ON RESERVE REDUCTIONS.
