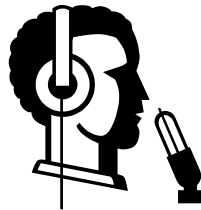


## TOMBALL ARCHEOLOGICAL RECOVERY

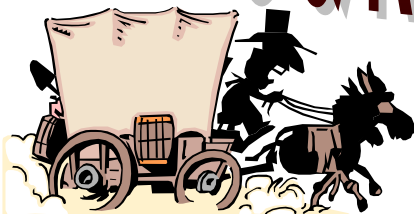

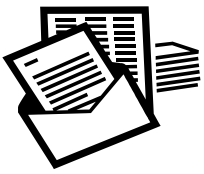

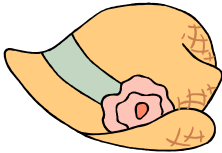
