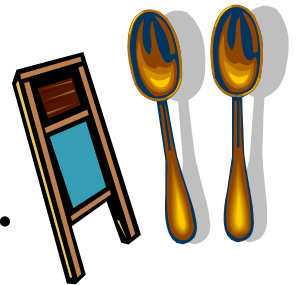
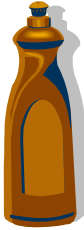
GAME TIME

Requirements:

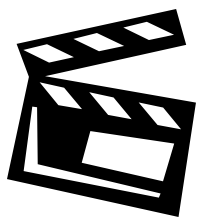
- 21 yrs or older

BLOOD PRESSURE

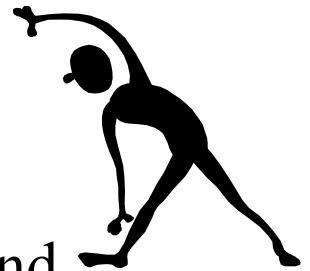


Come to the Center and have your blood pressure checked. This will be available to you every Tuesday and Thursday from 8 – 3p.m. We check and you track.

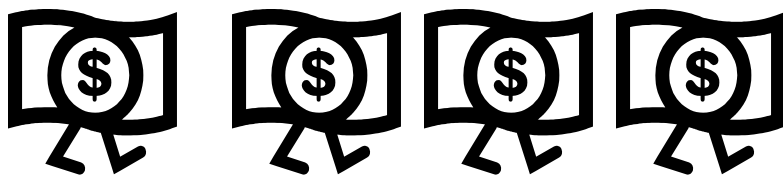

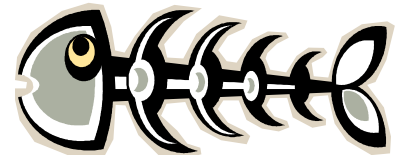

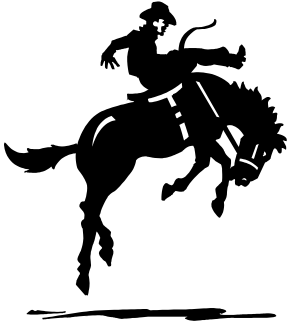
