




We will start playing bingo at 1p.m. sharp for all ages that would like to join us for a hour of fun. We have a lot of new prizes, so bring a friend and come on down.



A local author named "Dorothy Housdorfer" will come and share free ideas on writing personal essays for decedents. Please sign up in the office.




February 9th & 10th Noon till 4:00 p.m.
