FINAL ORDER

APPROVING THE APPLICATION OF BURNETT OIL COMPANY, INC.
TO ESTABLISH THE MOST EFFICIENT RATE OF PRODUCTION
BY AMENDING RULE 4 OF THE FIELD RULES ADOPTED IN
FINAL ORDER NO. 8A-0222732, ISSUED EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 2, 1999,
WILD HOG (BUNGER SAND) FIELD, KING COUNTY, TEXAS

The Commission finds that after statutory notice in the above-numbered docket heard on December 8, 1999, the presiding examiner has made and filed a report and recommendation containing findings of fact and conclusions of law, for which service was not required; that the proposed application is in compliance with all statutory requirements; and that this proceeding was duly submitted to the Railroad Commission of Texas at conference held in its offices in Austin, Texas.

The Commission, after review and due consideration of the examiner's report and recommendation, the findings of fact and conclusions of law contained therein, hereby adopts as its own the findings of fact and conclusions of law contained therein, and incorporates said findings of fact and conclusions of law as if fully set out and separately stated herein.

Therefore, it is **ORDERED** by the Railroad Commission of Texas that Rule 4 of the field rules adopted in Final Order No. 8A-0222732, issued effective November 2, 1999, for the Wild Hog (Burger Sand) Field, King County, Texas be and it is amended as hereafter set out.

RULE 4: The most efficient rate of production at the current time for wells in the Wild Hog (Bunger Sand) Field, King County, Texas, is established at 140 barrels of oil per day and the maximum permitted daily oil allowable for each well shall be 140 barrels of oil per day.

It is further **ORDERED** by the Railroad Commission of Texas that all overproduction for the wells in the Wild Hog (Bunger Sand) Field be and is hereby canceled.
