Original construction of the park was by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), a group created by President Roosevelt during the Great Depression to combat the dual issues of unemployment and the preservation of natural resources. From 1935 to 1938, when the park opened to the public, CCC companies 2891 and 1801-C constructed an earthen dam to impound the 80-acre lake, built scenic roads, quaint cabins and a bath house.

FACILITY INFORMATION

Check-in: Cabins and Bass Lodge, after 3 p.m.

Check-out: Additional charges apply upon failure to check out on time.
Cabins: 11 a.m.
Campsites: 2 p.m.
Day use: 10 p.m.
Renew permits by 9 a.m. on the due date.
Failure to renew may result in the loss of the site.

Quiet Hours

Please minimize noise from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Alcohol

Public consumption and/or display of alcohol is prohibited.

Prohibited Items

Metal detectors may not be used in the park.

Pets

Please keep pets safe, on a leash and attended at all times.
Only seeing-eye dogs are permitted inside buildings.
Pets are prohibited in swimming and beach areas.

Campfires

Gathering of firewood is prohibited. Firewood may be purchased at the State Park Store or you may bring your own.
Ground fires are prohibited.
You are welcome to use the fire rings and grills.
Observe posted burn bans.

Waste Disposal

Campers: Please use trash dumpsters provided.
Rest room garbage cans are for the convenience of rest room use.

Day use: These garbage cans are reserved for day-use visitors.

Recycle bins are provided only for aluminum cans.
Gray water is not to be dumped on the ground.
Dump stations are located in the park for your convenience.

Transportation

Rights-of-way are off-limits to all motorized vehicles.
All state traffic laws apply to park roads, including posted speed limits.

Payment is due at time of rental. Ask about age restrictions.

Boat Rental

Prices include tax. Rental of canoes, kayaks and boats include paddles and personal flotation devices.

Trial Run (0-1 hour)	\$11.00
Half Day (1-4 hours)	\$22.00
Full Day (4-8 hours)	\$33.00
Overnight (8-24 hours)	\$44.00
Two Day (24-48 hours)	\$66.00
