Cleburne State Park

Bubbling springs feed the cool, clear waters of Cedar Lake, the centerpiece of Cleburne State Park built in the 1930s by the Civilian Conservation Corps. The reservoir's small size makes it ideal for canoeing, paddle boating and fishing. Visitors also enjoy swimming, hiking, and camping in the park's shady grounds. Come experience Cleburne State Park, an ideal retreat any time from the stresses of modern life.



Camping: campsites with water/electricity or full hookups. Six screened shelters.



Group Facilities: group camp with two barracks and dining hall (capacity 44). Sponsored youth group area. Dining hall (capacity 75).



Picnicking: picnic tables and grills.



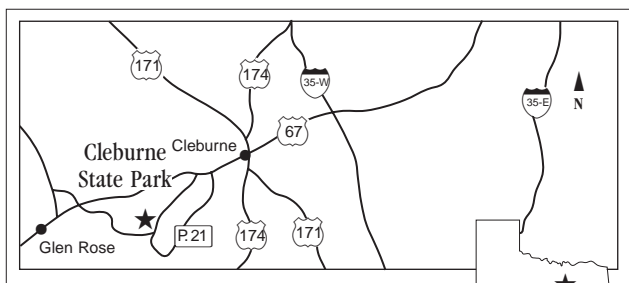
Boating: low speed only (no wake). Boat ramp.



Fishing: possible catches include largemouth bass, crappie and catfish.



Seasonal Store: paddle boat, canoe and boat rentals.



Located in Johnson County, six miles southwest of Cleburne on U.S. 67 to Park Road 21, then southwest on Park Road 21 for six miles.
