ot far from downtown Houston lies Brazos Bend State Park, a scenic haven for birdwatchers. wildlife observers and even stargazers. More than 270 species of birds have been sighted here, and the prehistoric-looking American alligator is the park's most noteworthy resident. Hiking and biking trails meander through the park's varied terrains, and several lakes offer excellent fishing.



Camping: campsites with water and electricity. Also screened shelters.



Group facilities: two group pavilions (capacity 75). Dining hall (capacity 100).



Picnicking: tables and grills in day-use area.



Fishing: excellent in lakes. Fishing piers.



Wildlife Observation: observation tower and platforms provide excellent viewing.




Trails: 22 miles of hiking and mountain-bike trails.
