Huntsville State Park

Tall pines tower over the shoreline of Lake Raven, a small reservoir that forms the heart of Huntsville State Park. Located in the Pineywoods of East Texas, the popular park offers a number of recreational activities, including fishing, boating, canoeing, swimming, hiking, horseback riding and cycling. In the lake, anglers pursue largemouth bass, crappie and catfish while miles of trails challenge hikers and bikers. The thick forest also supports a variety of wildlife, including many birds.



Camping: campsites with water only or water and electricity. Also screened shelters.



Group Facilities: picnic shelter (capacity 75 people) and Lodge (capacity 200 people).



Picnicking: picnic sites with tables and grills.



Nature Center: exhibits on the area's natural and cultural history.



Swimming: designated swimming area. Swim at your own risk.



Boating: no-wake/idle speed only enforced in lake. Boat ramp. Also canoeing, sailing and kayaking.



Fishing: lighted fishing piers. Possible catches include largemouth bass, crappie and flathead and channel catfish. (Catch and release on bass.)



Trails: hiking and biking (19 miles).



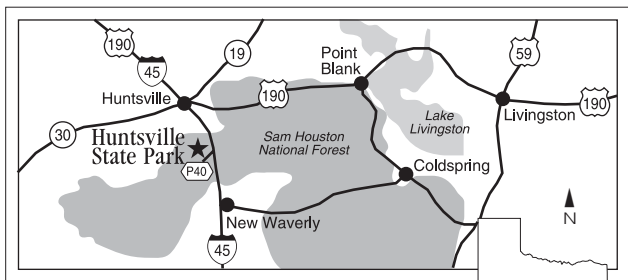
Horseback Riding: about one-hour-long guided ride; call (936) 295-1985 for reservations.



Concession: rentals of canoes, kayaks and flat-bottomed boats in season.



Texas State Parks Store: gifts, shirts, groceries and more.



Located in Walker County, eight miles south of Huntsville on Interstate 45, Exit 109, then west on Park Road 40.
