McKinney Falls State Park

Mckinney Falls State Park provides a quiet, natural retreat from the busy city of Austin located just minutes away. Trails throughout the park lead visitors to two small waterfalls, an Indian rock shelter, the ruins of an old homestead, a horse-trainer's cabin and the ruins of a grist mill. The park offers a wild-flower-lined, paved hike-and-bike trail as well as a more rugged trail ideal for mountain biking.



Camping: campsites with water and electricity and screened shelters.



Group Facilities: youth group camp area; group dining hall.



Picnicking: day-use picnic area with tables along Onion Creek.



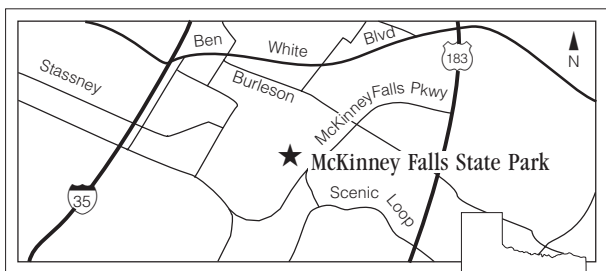
Swimming: swim at your own risk in Onion Creek. (No lifeguards on duty). Call (512) 243-1643 for water conditions.



Interpretive Center: exhibits about local natural history and history.



Trails: 3-mile paved hike-and-bike trail. Also 3-mile unpaved Homestead Trail for mountain biking and hiking. Short interpretive trail. Smith Rockshelter Trail leads to Indian rock shelter.



Located in Travis County, southeast of Austin, two miles west of U.S. 183 on McKinney Falls Parkway.
