Texas' best kept secret, is how one former governor described the spectacular geologic wonders and panorama of colors you will witness here. Visitors can enjoy the park's scenery by simply traveling along the paved 16 miles of roadway through the canyon or renting a horse for an up-close look. During the summer, "Texas," an outdoor drama, is performed in an open-air theater nestled at the foot of a high cliff.



Camping: Backpacking, equestrian sites, tent sites and RV sites with water and electricity.



Cabins: CCC-built rental cabins.



Picnicking: Over 100 picnic tables available in a variety of locations.



Trails: 30 miles of hiking and biking trails. Equestrian trails



Old West Stables: Guided horseback rides.




Interpretive Center: Exhibits about the history, geology and wildlife of the Canyon. Park Museum store.
