Lake Tawakoni State Park

Lake Tawakoni is a 37,800-acre water supply for surrounding communities and the City of Dallas, providing water-oriented recreation for much of central northeast Texas. Lake Tawakoni plays host to more than 30 fishing tournaments each year, and offers 376 state park acres with over five miles of shoreline, and a variety of other activities including fishing, boating, biking, geocaching, hiking and birding. There are also 40 acres of native tallgrass prairie, a unique ecosystem for East Texas.



Camping: campsites with water and electricity and a Youth Group Area that accommodates up to 35 campers.



Picnicking: 40 picnic tables and grills.



Swimming: beach front, boat-free zone, swimming area.



Birding: with the 205th species identified in 2005.



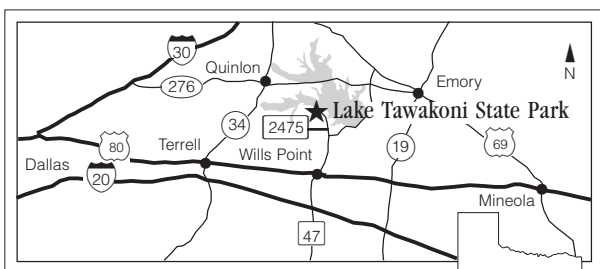
Boating: 4-lane boat ramp.



Fishing: catches include catfish, bass and crappie.



Trails: 5.5 miles of trails for hiking and mountain biking.
